SUMMARY, NOVEMBER, 1908.

During the month of November 13 vessels were fumigated and 49

inspected.

A year has elapsed since plague first appeared in Seattle. The total amount of infection found resolves itself into 3 human cases and 21 rats. The 3 human cases, all fatal, occurred in October, 1907. Two were pneumonic and 1 bubonic. From November 30, 1907, to November 30, 1908, 64,929 rats were brought to the laboratory. Of this number 55,955 were necropsied and examined for plague infection. Among those examined 19 plague-infected rats were found, 2 having been found prior to November 30, 1907. The percentage of infection is 0.033 per cent. Three plague rats were found from December 28, 1907, to January 7, 1908. Two were brought in during the last week of March, 1908, and 3 during April, 1908. These last 5 were definitely located as coming from the water front. During the latter part of June and early part of July, 9 plague rats were found in a wood yard at least half a mile east of the water front. This focus was promptly cleaned, and no further infection has been found there. The last plague rat was found September 26, 1908, on the water front.

During the month of November, 1908, the city trappers covered the water front, and more particularly that part lying between Yesler Way and the Smith Cove Waterway. Their traps were placed both below and on the street level. They brought in 524 rats from this locality, of which only 129 were from beneath the street level. The high tides have probably driven a number of the rats from their nesting places beneath the piling. No plague infection was found among

these rats.

Summary of plague laboratory work, month of November, 1908.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Chapin reports, December 7, through Passed Assistant Surgeon Glover:

During the month 4,845 rats were delivered at the laboratory, of which 3,961 were necropsied. No evidence of plague infection was found.

The last human plague case was discovered October 25, 1907, and the last plague-infected rat was delivered September 26, 1908.

Twelve rats were brought in alive during the month, yielding only 11 fleas.

CURRENT QUARANTINE MEASURES.

[From the Veröffentlichungen des Kaiserlichen Gesundheitsamtes, Berlin, November 25, 1908.]

CHOLERA.

Bulgaria.—September 20. Arrivals from Russian ports of the Black Sea and the Danube admitted only at the ports of Varna, Silistria, and Rustschuk. Such vessels are subject to 5 days' quarantine and thorough disinfection before receiving free pratique. Bilge water must be disinfected and renewed and drinking-water supply renewed. Passengers are subject to disinfection of effects and 5 days' quarantine. Vessels on which cholera has occurred within 5 days or which come from a cholera-infected port shall not be admitted under any circum-If a case, sick or recovered, is found on a Bulgarian vessel, the said case shall be landed and the vessel shall be sent back. Cholera vessels flying the Bulgarian flag shall be admitted to the port of Varna or that of Silistria, there to undergo quarantine. Vessels arriving from Russia which are not subject to the aforesaid conditions may unlade at Varna, Silistria, or Rustschuk, on condition that the cargo so unladed be held 5 days. The cargo handlers shall also be subject to 5 days' quarantine. The importation of susceptible articles is forbidden.

EGYPT.—November 11. Cholera regulations against Rustschuk no

longer in force.

France.—November 6. Decree of September 18 suspended, with exception of article 10 (prohibition of importation), article 12 (notification of cholera suspect cases), and article 13 (penalties).

ITALY.—November 15. Port of Singapore declared cholera infected. Russia.—November 14. The governments of Viterbsk, Vladimir, Kursk, Smolensk, Charkov, Rjasan, and Perm declared free of cholera; also the provinces of the Vistula.

Sweden.—November 12. The city of Taganrog and the government

of Tobolsk declared free of cholera.

Turkey.—November 10. Measures against arrivals from Russian ports of the Black Sea, with the exception of Taganrog and Batoom, replaced by medical inspection and disinfection of soiled clothing; the same to be performed at the lazaretto of Sinope or that of Monastir-

Aghzy. Pilgrim vessels subject to special measures.

November 11. Prohibition of articles of food from Russian ports into Turkey suspended, except as regards susceptible articles. Pilgrim vessels are allowed to transship such of their pilgrims as desire to proceed to the Hedjaz by railway at the lazaretto of Beirut. The vessel shall then proceed under quarantine to Abou Saad, and the transshipped pilgrims shall be subject to forty-eight hours' observation and careful disinfection. Travelers arriving in Turkey from Persia by land routes shall be subject to medical inspection.

PLAGUE.

CHINA.—October 27. Order of the German consul at Shanghai of October 19 relative to sanitary police control of arrivals from Tientsin and Chinwangtao and the ports of Shanghai and Woosung declared

Russia.—November 14. The island of Formosa and the cities of Bagdad and Osaka declared free of cholera.

BRAZIL.

Reports from Brazil—Inspection of vessels—Mortality—Plague and smallpox—Smallpox in Argentina, year 1907.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Stewart reports, November 8:

Two weeks ended November 7. Vessels inspected and received bills of health from this consulate-general: October 26, the British steamship Eversley, for Fort Morgan, Ala., in water ballast, with no passengers and no change in the crew personnel; on the same date, the British steamship Corsican Prince, for New York, in cargo of coffee, with no passengers and no change in the personnel.

October 27, the German steamship Seiglinde, for New York, in coffee cargo, with 11 steerage passengers and no change in the crew personnel; on the same date, the British steamship Milton, for New Orleans, in coffee cargo, with no passengers and with 1 new member of crew signed on here.

October 31, the Norwegian steamship *Polarstjernen*, for New York, in coffee cargo, with no passengers and with 2 new members of the crew taken on here; on the same date, the Brazilian steamship Goyaz, for New York, in coffee and miscellaneous cargo (for Brazilian coast ports), with 51 cabin and 42 steerage passengers and with all crew

November 3, the British steamship Lord Antrim, for Philadelphia, in cargo of manganese ore, with no passengers and no change in the crew personnel.

November 4, the British steamship *Tennyson*, for New York, with 23 cabin and 21 steerage passengers and with no change in the crew.

November 7, the British steamship Royal Prince, for New Orleans, in cargo of coffee, with no passengers and no change in the crew; on the same date, the British steamship *Richmond*, for New York, in water ballast, with no passengers and with no change in the personnel of the crew while in this port.

November 8, the Norwegian steamship Daghestan, for New York, in cargo of coffee, with no passengers and with 3 new members of the crew taken on in this port. These additional members of the crew were American sailors being returned to the United States.

No other vessel left this port for United States ports during the

period in question.

Mortality in city of Rio de Janeiro.—Week ended November 1, 1908. Total deaths, 414. No yellow fever. Plague caused 1 death, with 7 new reported cases. Smallpox caused 162 deaths, with 337 new reported cases, of which number 131 were in the suburban zone. the close of the week there were in the Hospital São Sebastião 245 cases of smallpox and 8 cases of plague under treatment; in the Hospital Engenho de Dentro, 160 cases of smallpox under treatment; in

the Hospital Paulo Candido, 167 convalescent cases of smallpox.

Week ended November 8. Total deaths, 374. Yellow fever caused no cases nor deaths. Plague caused 3 deaths, with 6 new reported cases, and smallpox 123 deaths, with 337 new reported cases, of which number 98 were in the suburban zone. At the close of the week there were in the Hospital São Sebastião 235 cases of smallpox and 8 cases of plague under treatment; in the Hospital Engenho de Dentro, 133 cases of smallpox under treatment; in the Hospital Paulo Candido, 163 convalescent cases from smallpox.

Total estimated population, 811,443. Census population, 1907,

628,675.

Smallpox in Argentina.—Smallpox was present in the followingnamed cities of the Republic of Argentina during the year 1907: Buenos Aires, 76 deaths; Mendoza, 57 deaths; Santa Fe, 2 deaths, and Rosario, 181 deaths.

The usual precautions were taken, holds fumigated, rat guards placed on wharf lines, and Asiatics' effects disinfected.

Week ended October 31, 10 deaths from cholera and 11 deaths from plague in Calcutta. In Bengal during the same week 75 cases and 53 deaths from plague. In India during the same period there were 3,020

cases and 2,140 deaths from plague.

GREAT BRITAIN—England and Wales.—The deaths registered in 76 great towns in England and Wales during the week ended November 21, 1908, correspond to an annual rate of 15.6 per 1,000 population, which is estimated at 16,234,952.

London.—One thousand three hundred and fifty-seven deaths were registered during the week, including measles 32, scarlet fever 8, diphtheria 16, enteric fever 11, whooping cough 7, tuberculosis 145, and 31 from diarrhea. The deaths from all causes correspond to an annual rate of 15.1 per 1,000. In Greater London 1,988 deaths were registered. In the "outer ring" the deaths included 5 from measles, 1 from scarlet fever, 5 from diphtheria, and 3 from whooping cough.

Ireland.-The average annual death rate represented by the deaths registered during the week ended November 21, 1908, in the 21 principal town districts of Ireland was 20.1 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,131,959. The lowest rate was recorded in Galway, viz, 3.9, and the highest in Wexford, viz, 42.0 per 1,000.

Scotland.—The deaths registered in 8 principal towns during the week ended November 21, 1908, correspond to an annual rate of 17.3 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,839,038. The highest rate of mortality was recorded in Leith, viz, 22.8, and the lowest in Paisley, viz, 10.4 per 1,000. The aggregate number of deaths registered from all causes was 610, including enteric fever 4, diphtheria 9, scarlet fever 8, measles 2, and 16 from whooping cough.
