Assistant Surgeon Chapin, plague laboratory, reports, April 5,

through Passed Assistant Surgeon Glover:

During the month of March, 1909, 3,616 rats were delivered at the laboratory and 3,563 were necropsied. No plague-infected rats were found. One hundred and fifty-four fleas were found upon 10 rats examined.

The last plague-infected rat was found September 26, 1908.

Nebraska—Lincoln.—Month of March, 1909. Estimated population, 60,000. Total number of deaths, 41, including whooping cough 1, enteric fever 2, and 4 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 3, scarlet fever 8, measles 73, and smallpox 12.

NEW HAMPSHIRE—Concord.—Annual report for the year 1908. Estimated population, 20,000. Total number of deaths, 428, corresponding to an annual death rate of 15.25 per 1,000 of population, including diphtheria 4, enteric fever 1, and 26 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 44, scarlet fever 7, enteric fever 6, and measles 100.

Note.—The steamship Queen Eleanor left without inspection.

Plague in Chile.—A press dispatch of March 17 from Santiago, Chile, states that plague has assumed alarming proportions in the cities of Magillones and Antofagasta. The measures for the suppression of this disease put in force by the health authorities have so far proved unsuccessful to abate the disease, and a large proportion of the population of these cities have fled.

Mortality in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.—Week ended March 14. Total estimated population, 811,443. Census population, 1907, 628,675. Total deaths, 276. No deaths from yellow fever or plague. reports:

Malaria exists in all its forms in the Kongo Free State and cases of blackwater fever are frequent. A few cases of beriberi have appeared in the interior. Leprosy is common in the eastern or lake region. No cases of plague or yellow fever have ever been treated at the hospitals or lazarettoes of the Belgian Government. Numerous cases of yellow fever have occurred at Dakkar in French Senegal and an outbreak of plague occurred at Akkra on the British Gold Coast in July, 1908, both places being in close communication with Port Banane,

Boma, and Matadi, in the Free State, by means of cargo boats which are not required to be fumigated and are usually infested with rate and roaches. The Stegomyia calopus mosquito abounds along the Kongo River. The Belgian Government has given much attention to the study of the sleeping sickness which at present exists in epidemic form in the Kongo. There are dangerous foci in the vicinity of Uganda, from which place the disease is believed to have been introduced. The disease is not strictly confined to natives. Cases occurring among foreigners are immediately isolated and placed under treatment in government lazarettoes in charge of European physicians and bacteriologists, of whom a large staff is employed by the government.

VENEZUELA.

Organization of Commission of Public Hygiene.

The following decree creating a commission of public hygiene is received from the American minister at Caracas, through the Department of State, under date of April 6:

Whereas it is necessary that there should be a consulting and technical board for studying and resolving scientifically questions of hygiene and public health until congress can legislate on this important branch of the administration—

DECREES.

ARTICLE 1.—There is hereby created, provisionally, in the city of Caracas, and under the minister of the interior, a consulting and technical board to be called the commission of public hygiene.

ART. 2.—This commission shall be competent to decide the follow-

ing:

1. All questions referring to the prevention of contagious diseases, quarantine, sanitary cordons, leper asylums, supply of vaccine and serum, and naval hygiene.

2. Hygienic methods for improving, from a health point of view, water systems, food products, medicines, and other substances and

provisions.

3. Methods for improving climate, for purification of the air, improvement of the soil, and hygienic construction for dwelling houses, workshops, and public buildings.

4. Advancement of social hygiene, including the prevention of

tuberculosis and the study of bacteriological diseases.

5. Public aid.

6. Medical statistics.

7. Sanitary legislation.

ART. 3.—The commission shall be constituted as follows: A consultor of hygiene who shall preside, 5 physicians, 1 engineer, and a lawyer. Four of the physicians shall be professors in the departments of hygiene, biological physics and chemistry, physiology, and bacteriology of the Central University, and the perpetual secretary of the Academy of Medicine. The remaining physician and the other members will be named in a separate resolution.

ART. 4.—The commission shall have a president, vice-president, and secretary, chosen by the commission itself from its members.

ART. 5.—The commission of public hygiene shall render weekly reports to the national government through the minister of the interior, such reports to give an account of the work of the commission and the sanitary state of the cities. It shall present resolutions in regard to the questions which the said ministry shall submit to it forits examination, and shall proceed immediately after its installation to elaborate projects of laws for public hygiene which the government shall submit to the national congress.

ART. 6. The carrying out of the decree is intrusted to the minister

of the interior.
