BELGIUM.

Outbreak of cholera at Boom.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Foster, at Antwerp, reports, November 8:

I arrived at Antwerp Sunday, November 7, and called upon Consul-General H. W. Diederich this morning. After learning from him as many details as possible concerning the epidemic of cholera at Boom, October 28, in company with Vice-Consul H. T. Sherman I visited the provincial secretary to ascertain the latest developments in the situation.

Boom is a town of 16,824 inhabitants, situated on the Ruppel, at the junction of the Brussels canal with that river.

The first case was in a worker on the roads. The manner in which he contracted the disease is not determined, but it appears that he went to the town of Willibroek where he came in contact with several lightermen who trade to Holland. It is supposed that in some way he became infected through them. He returned to Boom and there developed the disease, dying within 24 hours. The other 8 cases were evidently contracted from him, as the patients lived in adjoining houses. The disease appeared in a very virulent form, and all of the fatal cases except one died before the patients could be removed to the hospital. There have been 9 cases in all, which developed from October 26 to October 30. Six died. As soon as a positive diagnosis was made, the sick were removed to an isolated hospital and 30 persons who had been in contact with them were taken to an observation camp. The houses were disinfected and the water supply was examined. Four of the houses had a well in common, but no comma bacilli were found in it or in the water of the wells used by the other families.

No further cases have developed among the suspects and the authorities believe that the epidemic is stamped out, as it occurred in a small hamlet on the outskirts of the town. The government has ordered the medical boards to be on the alert and every case presenting any symptoms at all suspicious of cholera is to be reported at once by telegraph to the minister of agriculture and the provincial medical board.

No emigrants to the United States pass through Boom.

Week ended October 2. Supplemental bills of health issued to 4 steamships, the aggregate personnel of which amounted to 492. There were inspected 3 vessels, 219 members of crews, and 3 cabin and 21 steerage passengers, and there were disinfected by steam 18 pieces of steerage baggage; 1 piece was inspected and passed. Manifests were viséed for 11,894 pieces of freight. There were examined 27 emigrants for San Francisco per steamship *Nippon Maru*, of whom 20 were passed and 7 recommended for rejection on account of trachoma.

One plague rat was discovered in the northern district of the settlement, and 1 case of smallpox was reported to the municipal health department. The official returns for the week show 1 death from smallpox.

Week ended October 9. Supplemental bills of health granted to 4 steamships with an aggregate personnel of 918, and there were inspected 3 vessels, 194 members of crews, and 27 steerage passengers. There were bathed 59 members of crews and 27 steerage passengers, and their baggage, amounting to 94 pieces, was disinfected by steam. Manifests were viséed for 26,243 pieces of freight, and 10 pieces of freight, human hair, were disinfected by steam. There were examined and passed for San Francisco per steamship *Siberia* 29 emigrants, 3 of whom were recommended for rejection on account of trachoma.

Reports from Hankow for the periods ended October 2 and 9, respectively, show cases of cholera in the vicinity and 1 case of plague on a river steamer, and that dysentery is still prevalent.

Week ended October 16. Supplemental bills of health issued to 5 steamships, the aggregate personnel of which amounted to 1,200. There were inspected 4 vessels, 497 members of crews, and 4 cabin and 181 steerage passengers. Manifests were viséed for 17,168 pieces of freight. There were bathed 100 steerage passengers, and their effects, numbering 136 pieces, were disinfected by steam. There were examined 77 steerage passengers for San Francisco per steamship *China*, of whom 21 were recommended for rejection, 20 rejections being for trachoma. There were also examined 42 emigrants for Manila per steamship *Minnesota*, of whom 38 were passed and 4 recommended for rejection.

There was one case of beriberi on board the German steamship *Albenga*, and one similar case had been left in hospital at Kobe.

The general health conditions of this port remain practically unchanged.

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Smallpox in Naples.—During the week ended October 30, there were 3 cases of smallpox with 1 death reported at the health office of the city of Naples. A case of smallpox was discovered at the examination of the steerage passengers for the steamship *Madonna*, October 27. The patient was transferred to the Cotugno Hospital for contagious diseases. The contacts, 105 in number, were returned to their boarding houses and placed under observation; they were also revaccinated and their quarters disinfected.

October 25 the steamship *Menfi* arrived at Naples with 106 passengers from Alexandria and Beirut destined for the United States. These passengers were placed under observation and on inspection 1 case of smallpox was found among them. The patient was removed to the Cotugno Hospital and the contacts were vaccinated and their quarters disinfected.
