PLAGUE-PREVENTION WORK.

Passed Assistant Surgeon McCoy reports:

BERKELEY, CAL.

Last case of human plague sickened August 28, 1907. There is no record of rodent plague in Berkeley.

Week ended February 19, 1910. Rats trapped, 3. Bacteriologically examined, 3. No plague-infected rats found.

ALAMEDA COUNTY, CAL. (exclusive of Oakland).

Last case of human plague sickened 2 miles southwest of Sunol, September 26, 1909. Last plague-infected rodent was found February 5, 1910. To the present time 64 ground squirrels and 1 wood rat have been found infected.

Week ended February 19. Ranches inspected, 6. Ground squirrels shot, 20. Acres covered with poison, 100. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 20. No plague-infected squirrels found.

FRESNO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Fresno County. Week ended February 19. Ranches inspected, 28. Ground squirrels shot, 600. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 598. No plague-infected squirrels found.

MARIPOSA COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Mariposa County. Week ended February 19. Ranches inspected, 2. Ground squirrels shot, 21. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 21. No plague-infected squirrels found.

Smallpox on U.S. S. Washington and steamship Makura.

Doctor Ramus reports, February 12:

The U. S. S. Washington arrived at Honolulu January 31. A wireless message from the vessel was received several hours earlier, giving information of smallpox on board. Immediately on arrival the vessel was taken to the quarantine wharf and the 2 cases of smallpox and 2 men of the hospital corps were removed to the quarantine station. All precautions required by the quarantine laws and regulations had previously been taken on board from the time the men became sick. It was therefore deemed unnecessary to impose further measures than to hold the ship and personnel in quarantine until February 3.

March 11, 1910 302

One of the smallpox patients died shortly after removal to the quarantine station. He had been unsuccessfully vaccinated about 18 months previously. The man had shore leave at Yokohama January 11 and 12. The fleet left Shanghai December 30 and arrived at Yokohama January 3. The man first reported sick January 22. The second case fell sick January 22. The patient had had liberty at Yokohama from January 13 to 16.

The steamship Makura arrived from Sydney, Brisbane, and Suva February 3 with a case of smallpox on board. The patient was a child 3 years old, who had been vaccinated more than one year previously. She became sick when 2 days out from Brisbane, and the case ran a typical smallpox course, convalescence being well advanced on arrival at Honolulu. The Brisbane bill of health was clean. The patient came from the vicinity of Brisbane. No proper precautions had been taken on the vessel, and it was deemed necessary to enforce the quarantine regulations in regard to passengers for Honolulu who had been exposed to infection. Fifty-two passengers and 7 steerage passengers are now in quarantine detention.

INDIA.

BOMBAY-Increase in Plague and Smallpox.

Consul Dennison reports, January 27:

Week ended January 25. There was an alarming increase in mortality from plague and smallpox in Bombay. The sanitary report shows 82 cases of smallpox, with 30 deaths, as against 17 cases for the week ended January 18, and 10 in the corresponding week of 1909. Of these cases 27 were imported, 25 having been landed from the Jiddah pilgrim ships. These pilgrim ships arrive in Bombay in a most filthy and insanitary condition, a large percentage of their passengers having died at sea and others being often infected with contagious diseases. This being the season for returning pilgrims, there is every reason to fear that with these infected persons and contacts steadily pouring into the city there will be an epidemic.

In the same week plague deaths rose to 28, as against 19 in the previous week and 16 in the corresponding week of 1909. The percentage

of plague-infected rats caught is also rising.

The total mortality during the week amounted to 701, as compared with 600 in the same week last year, which is 108 above the figure for the week ended January 11, and only 60 below the mean of the last five years. The death rate has risen suddenly to 37.27 per thousand.

CALCUTTA.-Cholera, Plague, and Smallpox.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Allan reports, February 3:

Week ended January 22. At Calcutta there were 87 deaths from cholera, 8 from plague, and 1 death from smallpox. In all Bengal, 1,401 cases of plague with 1,222 deaths; in all India, 12,405 cases of plague with 10,928 deaths.

Cerebro-spinal meningitis.—Several cases of epidemic cerebro-spinal meningitis have appeared at Callao and Lima. With one exception the cases occurred in the same company of the regular army. The sanitary authorities have instituted measures to check the spread of the disease. The origin of the outbreak has not been determined, but there is reason to believe that the disease has long existed in Peru and has not been recognized until the present time. Many similar cases have been diagnosed as tuberculous meningitis or severe typhoid fever, and in one such case bacteriologic examination showed the presence of the diplococcus of Weichelselbaum.

Funigation of vessels.—Week ended January 15: Three steamships, with an aggregate of 208 in crews and 99 cabin and 41 steerage passengers, were funigated; week ended January 22, one steamship, with 112 in crew and 66 cabin and 17 steerage passengers, funigated; week ended February 5, two steamships, with 147 in crews and 32 cabin

and 7 steerage passengers, fumigated.

(Report for week ended January 29 was published in Public Health Reports, February 25, 1910.)

RUSSIA.

Plague and Typhus Fever-Examination of Emigrants.

The following information, dated February 9, was received from Minister Rockhill at St. Petersburg through the Department of State, February 28:

A communication from the foreign office states that from January 17 to 25, 13 cases of plague, with 11 deaths, occurred in the village of Naourzali-Tchagil, Kirghiz Steppe, government of Astrakhan, and that the first maritime district of the Kirghiz Steppe is infected.

Acting Assistant Surgeon De Forest at Libau reports, February 14: Week ended February 13. At Astrakhan, 1 case of plague with 3 deaths was reported. At Riga 197 cases of typhus fever were reported February 1 and 14 new cases February 11, with 207 cases under treatment in hospital. Precautions against spread of the disease are being strictly enforced.

For steamship *Estonia*, sailing for New York February 15, 714 emigrants have been examined and 120 pieces of baggage disinfected.

England and Wales.—The deaths registered in 76 great towns correspond to an annual rate of 17 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 16,713,617.

Ireland.—The deaths registered in 21 principal town districts correspond to an annual rate of 23 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,151,790. The lowest rate was recorded at Lurgan, viz, 4, and the highest at Newtownards, viz, 51.5.

Scotland.—The deaths registered in 8 principal towns correspond to an annual rate of 20.5 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,864,194. The lowest rate was recorded at Perth, viz, 15.4, and the highest at Greenock, viz, 29.8. The total number of deaths from all causes was 744, including typhoid fever 4, measles 46, scarlet fever 11, diphtheria 14.

ITALY—Genoa.—Two weeks ended February 15, 1910. Population 279,163. Total number of deaths from all causes 273, including typhoid fever 3, tuberculosis 16.

Jamaica—Kingston.—Month of January, 1910. Population 48,500. Total number of deaths from all causes 161, including tuberculosis 18.

Spain—Seville.—Month of January, 1910. Population 154,315. Total number of deaths from all causes 480, including typhoid fever 3, smallpox 7, measles 1, diphtheria 1, tuberculosis 82.
