PLAGUE-PREVENTION WORK.

INTIMATE ASSOCIATION OF RATS AND GROUND SQUIRRELS.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Converse reports:

Recent observations show several points of intimate contact between rats and squirrels in the immediate outskirts of San Francisco.

The facility with which bubonic plague might be transferred from plague-infected rats to healthy squirrels and vice versa from plague-infected ground squirrels to the noninfected rat population of a city is illustrated by the finding, on the immediate outskirts of San Francisco, of several places where rats (*Mus norvegicus*) and ground squirrels (*Citellus beecheyi*) have been found to live in the same burrows.

The first of these locations is a ravine, on one side of which are situated a tannery and a cluster of old and more or less dilapidated houses and on the other open fields. At the bottom of the ravine runs a small stream, which also serves the purpose of a sewer for several groups of houses situated farther upstream. A number of squirrel holes are to be seen along the bank, and several mounds along the stream at this point are perforated with them.

One of the foremen employed in the work of rat trapping noticed, on passing the spot, that both rats and squirrels were present. Traps were placed in the holes and rats and squirrels were caught from the same burrow. One of the squirrels, captured alive, was combed for fleas at the laboratory. From this one squirrel there were recovered *Ceratophyllus acutus*, 47 specimens, *Ctenopsyllus musculi*, 2 specimens, the first being the common squirrel flea, the second, a rat flea.

The second location is a chicken and duck ranch on which is situated a barn which was found to be rat-infested. There are a number of squirrel burrows in the fields immediately adjoining. At the time of the first observation this place was vacant. The squirrels had approached the barn, but on the sudden appearance of the

trapper had disappeared under the barn as a temporary hiding place. No doubt a number of other such points of contact will be discovered.

In each of these instances the rats, by short migration, are in contact with the rat population of the city and the squirrels are in contact with other squirrel colonies in the open country.

Passed Assistant Surgeon McCoy reports:

SAN FRANCISCO, CAL.

Last case of human plague sickened January 30, 1908. Last case of rodent plague trapped October 23, 1908. Total number of rats found infected to date, 398.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Premises inspected, 800. Houses destroyed, 19. Buildings condemned, 3. Nuisances abated, 68. Poisons placed, 7,800. Rats trapped, 2,014. Rats found dead, 23. Gophers trapped, 20. Rats identified, 2,037, as follows: *Mus norvegicus*, 1,614; *Mus rattus*, 95; *Mus musculus*, 281; *Mus alexandrinus*, 47. Average number of traps set daily, 7,473. Examined bacteriologically, 1,555 rats and 7 gophers. No plague infection found.

BERKELEY, CAL.

There is no record of rodent plague in Berkeley. The last case of human plague sickened August 28, 1907.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Rats trapped, 16. Rats identified, 16, all being *Mus norvegicus*. Rats examined bacteriologically, 16. No plague infection found.

OAKLAND, CAL.

Last case of human plague sickened October 26, 1909. Last case of rodent plague found December 1, 1908.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Rats found dead, 54. Rats trapped, 533. Rats identified, 587, as follows: *Mus norvegicus*, 516; *Mus musculus*, 71. Rats examined bacteriologically, 516. No plague-infected rats found.

ALAMEDA COUNTY, CAL. (Exclusive of the city of Oakland.)

Last case of human plague sickened 2 miles southwest of Sunol, September 26, 1909. Last case of rodent plague found March 25, 1910. To the present time 76 ground squirrels and 1 wood rat have been found infected.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 8. Ground squirrels shot, 76. Acres covered with poison, 149. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 76. No plague-infected squirrels found.

FRESNO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Fresno County.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 29. Ground squirrels shot, 910. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 901. No plague-infected squirrels found.

MERCED COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Merced County. Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 5. Ground squirrels shot, 293. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 288. No plague-infected squirrels found.

MONTEREY COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Monterey County. Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 34. Ground squirrels shot, 551; found dead, 1. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 547. No plague-infected squirrels found.

SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human plague in San Luis Obispo County. A plague-infected rodent was found January 29, 1910.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 9. Ground squirrels shot, 232. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 230. No plague-infected squirrels found.

SAN MATEO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in San Mateo County.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 7. Ground squirrels shot, 168. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 165. No plague-infected squirrels found.

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Santa Barbara County.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 18. Ground squirrels shot, 362. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 356. No plague-infected squirrels found.

SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human plague in Santa Clara County. A plague-infected rodent was found November 3, 1909. Total number of ground squirrels found infected to date, 9.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 6. Ground squirrels shot, 104. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 100. No plague-infected squirrels found.

TULARE COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Tulare County.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 9. Ground squirrels shot, 419. Rabbits shot, 1. Examined bacteriologically, 414 squirrels and 1 rabbit. No plague infection found.

VENTURA COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Ventura County.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Ranches inspected, 15. Ground squirrels shot, 64. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 60. No plague-infected squirrels found.

Assistant Surgeon Chapin reports:

SEATTLE, WASH.

No case of human plague since October 30, 1907. The last plague-infected rat was found February 8, 1910.. Total plague-infected rats to date, 22.

Week ended April 23, 1910. Rats received, 848. Rats necropsied, 668. . No plague-infected rats found.

JAPAN.

YOKOHAMA—Inspection of Vessels.

Surgeon Irwin reports April 11:

Week ended April 9. Bills of health issued to the following-named vessels: Steamships *Inveric* and *Montrose* for New York, *Tacoma Maru* for Tacoma, *Chiyo Maru* for Seattle, and *Suveric*, *Minnesota*,

and *Teucer* for Manila. These vessels carried an aggregate of 301 passengers, 294 steerage passengers, and 853 in crews.

Infected rats are still being found at Kobe. At Osaka 2 cases of plague were reported in February. General vaccination is to be begun at Yokohama April 15.

KOBE—Inspection of Vessels.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Smith reports, April 6:

Week ended April 2. Supplemental bills of health granted to 5 steamships. Members of crews inspected, 983, and steerage passengers, 1,133. Steerage passengers bathed, 37; effects disinfected. Pieces of baggage steamed, 47; bedding, 74. Manifests viséed for 56,524 pieces of freight amounting to 4,567 tons. One case of personal effects and 12 cases of human hair disinfected with formalin.

Emigrants inspected and passed as follows: Per steamship *Manchuria*, for Honolulu 13, for San Francisco 6. Per steamship *Chiyo Maru*, for Honolulu 9, for San Francisco 9. The emigrants were 7 days in detention at Ono quarantine station before embarkation.

NAGASAKI—Smallpox on Steamship Asia.

Sanitary Inspector Bowie reports, April 7:

The steamship *Asia* from Hongkong to San Francisco arrived at this port, April 7, with a case of smallpox on board in the person of a Filipino steerage passenger. The case was discovered April 6 and promptly isolated by the ship's surgeon and the steerage passengers and crew were vaccinated. The patient was removed at the quarantine station and the quarters were washed down with an antiseptic solution. The vessel was then allowed to come into harbor and the first-class passengers were permitted to land.

April 26, Passed Assistant Surgeon Ramus at Honolulu reported the arrival of the steamship *Asia* with a history of a second case of smallpox, which occurred en route from Nagasaki to Yokohama in a Filipino steerage passenger. The patient was removed at Yokohama and disinfection was carried out.

JAVA.

Cholera at Samarang and Soerabaya.

The following information was received from the Department of State under date of May 3:

The consul at Batavia reports cholera still present at Samarang. At Soerabaya 80 cases with 70 deaths occurred during the month of March.

MEXICO.

Report from the Superior Board of Health of Mexico.

In compliance with articles 1 and 2 of the International Sanitary Convention held at Washington October 9-14, 1905, the president of the Superior Board of Health of Mexico reports, May 2, that no case of yellow fever and no death from the said disease were registered in the Mexican Republic during the week ended April 30, and that the prophylactic measures reported under date of September 28, 1908, continue to be carried out.

Investigation of the Status of Leprosy in Mexico.

The following circular, addressed by the Federal Government to the governors of the States and Territories of the Mexican Republic, was forwarded April 27 by Acting Assistant Surgeon Goldthwaite, at Veracruz:

The Mexican Government has ordered a special study to be made of the development of leprosy in the various parts of that country, with the object of determining the means that should be adopted for combating this terrible scourge, and has issued a circular to the governors of States and Territories asking for information covering the following points:

1. In what places does leprosy exist and what is the number of persons affected at each place? A list of these is requested, stating the age and sex of persons.
2. The number of pesthouses or hospitals for the treatment of patients, their location, capacity, and the number of lepers that have been isolated, together with a statement showing the funds available for their maintenance.
3. What are the measures that may have already been ordered or, in your judgment, ought to be adopted, to combat the leprosy and prevent its spread?

COATZACOALCOS—Inspection of Vessels—Smallpox on Railway.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Thompson reports, April 28:

Week ended April 27. Vessels inspected: April 22, steamship *San Antonio* for Philadelphia; April 24, steamship *Student* for a port in the United States via Mexican ports; April 26, steamship *Massachusetts* for Delaware Breakwater; April 27, steamship *Sokoto* for Pensacola via Progreso; *Texas* for New Orleans, and *Manuel Calvo* for New York via Habana. The *Texas* was fumigated.

During the month of March, 1910, smallpox was reported at Santo Domingo and Rincon Viejo on the Tehuantepec National Railway between Coatzacoalcos and Salina Cruz. The chief surgeon for the railway states that all unvaccinated persons have been vaccinated and that 21 days have elapsed since the occurrence of the last case.

PERU.**CALLAO—Inspection of Vessels—Plague.**

Acting Assistant Surgeon Castro-Gutierrez reports, April 19:

Week ended April 2. Three steamships having an aggregate personnel of 151 and 72 cabin and 7 steerage passengers were inspected. Of these vessels 2 were fumigated. Week ended April 9. One steamship with 97 in crew and 49 cabin and 42 steerage passengers was inspected and fumigated.

Bills of health show plague present at Mollendo, Peru, April 4, at Iquique, Chile, April 3, and at Antofagasta, Chile, April 2, with 4 cases in lazaretto.

PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Victor G. Heiser, chief quarantine officer of the Philippine Islands, reports, March 28:

Decrease of Cholera.

The Philippines are probably more free of cholera to-day than has been the case for a number of years past. For the entire week only 12 cases were reported for the islands, and on some days no cases were reported. A determined effort is being made by the bureau of health to isolate every case promptly in order to ascertain whether the disease can be stamped out completely, and at the same time learn with more or less certainty whether the disease is endemic or whether it must be reintroduced from a foreign country to start a new outbreak.

Beriberi.

In view of the recent results reported by Fraser and Stanton of the Straits Settlements, Aron of the Philippine Medical School, and others before the meeting of the Far Eastern Association of Tropical Medicine recently held in Manila, that beriberi is due to the continuous consumption of polished rice as a staple article of diet, and that the direct cause of this is probably due to the lack of phosphorous which is removed by the polishing, and that beriberi is probably a phosphorus starvation, the beriberi patients in the hospitals of the bureau of health have been treated by administering rice polishings, with the result that the cases promptly commenced to improve, and soon recovered. Unpolished rice has now been used in public institutions in which beriberi was rife during the past month, with the result that the disease has completely disappeared.

The disease made its appearance at sea, 8 members of the crew being attacked. Of this number 4 died. The vessel was sent to the quarantine anchorage and the 4 patients and 140 passengers were placed in quarantine at the station. All contacts were quarantined.
