#### PLAGUE-PREVENTION WORK.

Passed Assistant Surgeon McCoy reports:

#### SAN FRANCISCO, CAL.

Last case of human plague sickened January 30, 1908. Last case of rodent plague trapped October 23, 1908. Total number of rats found infected to date, 398.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Premises inspected, 5,216. Houses destroyed, 4. Buildings condemned, 4. Nuisances abated, 61. Poisons placed, 6,500. Rats trapped, 2,263. Rats found dead, 40. Gophers trapped, 6. Rats identified, 2,303, as follows: Mus norvegicus, 1,779; Mus rattus, 79; Mus musculus, 351; Mus alexandrinus 94. Average number of traps set daily, 7,621. Examined bacteriologically, 1,678. No plague-infected rats found.

#### BERKELEY, CAL.

There is no record of rodent plague in Berkeley. The last case of

human plague sickened August 28, 1907.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Rats trapped, 6. Rats identified, 6, all being Mus norvegicus. Rats examined bacteriologically, 6. No plague-infected rats found.

#### OAKLAND, CAL.

Last case of human plague sickened October 26, 1909. Last case of

rodent plague found December 1, 1908.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Rats found dead, 22. Rats trapped, 595. Rats identified, 617, as follows: Mus norvegicus, 530; Mus rattus, 1; Mus musculus, 84; Mus alexandrinus, 2. Rats examined bacteriologically, 522.

#### ALAMEDA COUNTY, CAL. (Exclusive of the city of Oakland).

Last case of human plague sickened 2 miles southwest of Sunol September 26, 1909. Last case of rodent plague found March 25, 1910. To the present time 76 squirrels and 1 wood rat have been found infected.

Week ended May 7, 1910. No ground squirrels taken. Acres covered with poison, 23.

#### MONTEREY COUNTY, CAL.

No record of human or rodent plague in Monterey County.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 36. Ground squirrels shot, 760; found dead, 1. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 758. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SAN BENITO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human plague in San Benito County. A

plague-infected rodent was found October 15, 1909.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 6. Ground squirrels shot, 35. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 30. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in San Joaquin

County.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 105. Ground squirrels shot, 125. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 116. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human plague in San Luis Obispo County. A

plague-infected rodent was found January 29, 1910.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 12. Ground squirrels shot, 255. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 248. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SAN MATEO COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in San Mateo County. Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 11. Ground squirrels shot, 151. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 144. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SANTA BARBARA COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Santa Barbara

County.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 4. Ground squirrels shot, 166. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 162. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human plague in Santa Clara County. A plague-infected rodent was found November 3, 1909. Total number of ground squirrels found infected to date, 9.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 12. Ground squirrels shot, 381. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 376. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### SANTA CRUZ COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human plague in Santa Cruz County. A plague-infected rodent was found November 6, 1909.

Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 14. Ground squirrels shot, 55. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 48. No plague-infected squirrels found.

#### STANISLAUS COUNTY, CAL.

There is no record of human or rodent plague in Stanislaus County. Week ended May 7, 1910. Ranches inspected, 2. Ground squirrels shot, 85; found dead, 3. Ground squirrels examined bacteriologically, 88. No plague-infected squirrels found.

## FOREIGN AND INSULAR.

#### IQUIQUE-Plague Conditions.

Consul Hanna reports, April 12:

During the three months ended March 31, 1910, there were 69

cases of plague, with 21 deaths at Iquique.

Bubonic plague is endemic at Iquique, the number of cases increasing in the months of March, April, and May, the season of humidity between the hot weather of December, January, and February and the succeeding season of cold weather when the disease again declines. The percentage of deaths from plague is not high except among the poorer classes. Disinfection of infected houses is carried out and effects are burned or disinfected.

Rats are numerous in Iquique, and although measures of extermination are applied on request of householders the construction of the wooden houses in the city prevents an effective campaign for rat destruction.

#### CHINA.

#### AMOY-Plague-Inspection of Vessels.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Moorhead reports, April 12 and 21:

During the week ended April 16, a death from pneumonic plague occurred in the international settlement of Kulangsu. The patient was a foreign physician who acquired the infection from a fatal case of pneumonic plague in a Chinese, which he had been attending. The physician died on the fourth day of illness. Examination of the sputum showed plague bacilli. All persons in immediate attendance on this case were inoculated with Haffkine serum. No further cases have developed.

Week ended April 9. Supplemental bill of health issued to steamship Kaifong, for Cebu and Manila, with 57 in crew and 29 cabin and 21 steerage passengers. Week ended April 16. Bill of health issued to steamship Yingchow, for Manila, with 53 in crew and 11 cabin and 91 steerage passengers. All passengers on these vessels were vacci-The crews were bathed, and their clothing was disinfected with steam. All were examined immediately prior to sailing. Two passengers by the steamship Yingchow were held for trachoma. Manifests were viséed for 164 and 218 packages of freight, respectively.

Quarantine restrictions enforced by and against Hongkong remain as reported March 26.

## Further Relative to Cases of Smallpox on Steamship Manchuria and U. S. S. Albatross. $^a$

Doctor Ramus reported April 28:

The steamship Manchuria arrived at Honolulu April 8 from Yokohama with a case of smallpox on board in the person of a steerage passenger from Hongkong. The case developed 11 days out from Hongkong. The patient was isolated with an attendant who had had smallpox, and all on board were vaccinated. On arrival at Honolulu the Manchuria was taken to the quarantine wharf, and the patient, with his effects and nurse, was transferred to the isolation ward of the quarantine station hospital. The effects of all steerage passengers were disinfected and the steerage compartments were fumigated with sulphur. No new case of smallpox developed.

The U.S.S. Albatross arrived at Honolulu from Yokohama April 15 with a case of smallpox in the person of a seaman. The case developed 5 days previous to arrival at Honolulu and the patient

was isolated on board with an attendant. On arrival the vessel was taken to the quarantine station, the patient was removed, and the entire personnel were vaccinated. The crew were held in quarantine while in port. They were bathed and their clothing was disinfected. The hospital and quarters of crew were disinfected.

#### HONDURAS.

#### PUERTO CORTEZ, Fruit Port-Sanitary Conditions.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Stowe reports, May 10:

The sanitary condition of the port and surrounding country is good and there are no quarantinable diseases present. The work of draining and filling in the town has been discontinued since last year.

There are about 200 overground cisterns in use, the majority of which are either unscreened or ineffectually screened. A few householders oil their cisterns. Mosquitoes are not numerous, those present being for the most part *Culex*.

#### JAPAN.

#### YOKOHAMA-Typhoid Fever in Japan-Inspection of Vessels.

Surgeon Irwin reports, April 23 and 25, and May 2:

An epidemic of typhoid fever is reported at Tokyo, with 600 cases. The sanitary bureau reports 3,320 cases with 700 deaths in the Empire, exclusive of Formosa, from January 1 to date, 135 cases of dysentery with 36 deaths, and 13 cases of smallpox with 3 deaths. At Yokohama since January 1 there have been 33 cases of typhoid fever with 7 deaths; remaining under treatment, 15. The local press reports 2,900, 715 rats destroyed in the city of Yokohama during the year 1909.

Week ended April 23. Bills of health were issued to the following-named vessels: Steamships Amiral Fourichon for San Francisco, Aymeric for Seattle, and Chicago Maru for Manila. These vessels carry a total of 193 in crews, 11 cabin passengers, and 12 steerage passengers. Week ended April 30. Bills of health issued to: Steamships Kamarakura Maru for Seattle, Mongolia for San Francisco, Siberia and Nikko Maru for Manila, Aragonia for New York, and Strathlorne for San Francisco. These vessels carried an aggregate of 839 in crews and 400 cabin and 81 steerage passengers. The steamships Nikko Maru and Aragonia were fumigated.

A case of smallpox was taken at Nagasaki from the steamship Mongolia, which sailed from Yokohama April 27, and a further case was taken from the vessel at Kobe. All the usual precautions were

observed at both ports.

#### KOBE-Inspection of Vessels-Smallpox.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Moore reports, April 20:

Week ended April 16. Supplemental bills of health granted to 8 steamships. Members of crews inspected, 795; steerage passengers, 222. Members of crews bathed, 127; steerage passengers, 9. Pieces of baggage steamed, 321; bedding, 18. Manifests viséed for 52,836 pieces of freight amounting to 4,431 tons. One case of human hair and 4 cases of personal effects were disinfected.

Emigrants were inspected and passed as follows: Per steamship Asia for Honolulu, 8; for San Francisco, 1. The emigrants for Hono-

lulu were vaccinated.

The official returns of infectious diseases show 1 case of smallpox in Kobe.

MEXICO.

#### Report from the Superior Board of Health of Mexico.

In compliance with articles 1 and 2 of the International Sanitary Convention held at Washington October 9–14, 1905, the president of the Superior Board of Health of Mexico reports, May 16, that no case of yellow fever and no death from the said disease were registered in the Mexican Republic during the week ended May 14, and that the prophylactic measures reported under date of September 28, 1908, continue to be carried out.

#### COATZACOALCOS-Inspection and Fumigation of Vessels.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Thompson reports, May 12:

Week ended May 11. Vessels inspected as follows: May 7, steamships *Croatia* for Norfolk via Mexican ports, and *Californian* for Delaware Breakwater; May 10, steamships *Nicaragua* for Port Arthur, Tex., and *Earnham* for New Orleans. The *Nicaragua* and *Earnham* were fumigated.

Formosa.—Four weeks ended April 9, 1910. Population, 3,132,335. Total number of deaths from all causes not reported. Two deaths from typhoid fever, 3 from smallpox, and 2 from plague reported.

FRANCE—Marseille.—Month of April, 1910. Population, 517,498. Total number of deaths from all causes 938, including typhoid fever 9, measles 14, scarlet fever 4, diphtheria 2, tuberculosis 133.

GREAT BRITAIN.—Week ended April 23, 1910.

ENGLAND AND WALES.—The deaths registered in 77 great towns correspond to an annual rate of 13.7 per 1,000 of the aggregate population which is estimated at 16,940,895.

Ireland.—The deaths registered in 21 principal town districts correspond to an annual rate of 22.4 per 1,000 of the population which is estimated at 1,151,790. The lowest rate was recorded at Ballymena, viz, 4.8, and the highest at Drogheda, viz, 45.

Scotland.—The deaths registered in 8 principal towns having an aggregate estimated population of 1,891,936, correspond to an annual rate of 17.4 per 1,000 of the population. The lowest rate was recorded at Paisley, viz, 11.7, and the highest at Dundee, viz, 32.8 per 1,000. The total number of deaths from all causes was 630, including measles 44, scarlet fever 5, diphtheria 2.

Jamaica.—Month of April, 1910. Population, 48,500. Total number of deaths from all causes 150, including tuberculosis 15.

PORTUGUESE EAST AFRICA—Lourenço Marquez.—Month of March, 1910. Population, 10,000. Total number of deaths from all causes 49, including tuberculosis 5.
