PELLAGRA IN FLORIDA.

Report by Dr. J. Y. PORTER, State Health Officer of Florida.

The figures given below are summarized from reports made by various members of the medical profession in answer to inquiries as to the prevalence of pellagra in the past and at the present time.

During the years 1909 and 1910, pellagra was diagnosed and treated in 22 of the 47 counties in Florida, there being a total of 91 cases with 41 deaths, distributed among the races and sexes as follows:

It is very evident that the deaths among the colored population have not been completely reported.

Twenty-eight of the cases were reported from the State Hospital for the Insane, at Chattahoochee.

The reports are so incomplete in details that I am unable to even make an estimate of the number of cases on hand.

The physicians who have made reports of cases are being further requested to furnish details as to race, sex, age, recoveries, and fatalities.

COLORADO.—Three months ended September 30, 1910. Population 653,506. Total number of deaths from all causes 2,778, including typhoid fever 105, measles 11, scarlet fever 13, diphtheria 35, tuberculosis 454. Cases reported: Typhoid fever 1,105, smallpox 115, measles 214, scarlet fever 330, diphtheria 275.

FLORIDA.—Week ended November 19, 1910. Reports from the state board of health show typhoid fever present in 3 localities with 4 cases, smallpox in 5 counties (Duval, Escambia, Gadsden, Leon, Polk) with 22 cases, scarlet fever in 1 locality (Pensacola) with 1 case, diphtheria in 3 localities with 4 cases, malaria in 4 localities with 14 cases, tuberculosis in 4 localities with 7 cases.

INDIANA.—Month of September, 1910. Population 2,732,550. Total number of deaths from all causes 2,870, including typhoid fever 158, diphtheria 27, tuberculosis 334. Cases reported: Typhoid fever 800 cases in 83 counties, smallpox 1 case in Marion County, diphtheria 231 cases in 42 counties.

IOWA.—Month of October, 1910. Population 2,192,608. Total number of deaths from all causes 1,615, including typhoid fever 49, measles 3, scarlet fever 3, diphtheria 19, tuberculosis 128.

KENTUCKY—*Louisville*.—Month of October, 1910. Population 269,749. Total number of deaths from all causes 243, including typhoid fever 5, diphtheria 4, tuberculosis 37. Cases reported: Scarlet fever 25, diphtheria 51, tuberculosis, pulmonary, 32.

OKLAHOMA.—Month of September, 1910. Population 1,681,584. Total number of deaths from all causes 676, including typhoid fever 98, smallpox 2, scarlet fever 4, diphtheria 11, tuberculosis 37. Cases reported: Typhoid fever 551, smallpox 65, scarlet fever 46, diphtheria 124, tuberculosis 73.

OREGON.—Month of July, 1910. Population 515,540. Total number of deaths from all causes 440, including typhoid fever 6, diphtheria 6, tuberculosis 39. Cases reported: Typhoid fever 35, measles 60, scarlet fever 32, diphtheria 53, tuberculosis 19.

Month of August, 1910. Total number of deaths from all causes 504, including typhoid fever 20, scarlet fever 1, diphtheria 3, tuberculosis 38. Cases reported: Typhoid fever 85, measles 36, scarlet fever 28, diphtheria 49, tuberculosis 18.

Month of September, 1910.—Total number of deaths from all causes 443, including typhoid fever 17, scarlet fever 2, diphtheria 9, tuberculosis 30. Cases reported: Typhoid fever 90, smallpox 12, measles 24, scarlet fever 21, diphtheria 54, tuberculosis 27.

FOREIGN AND INSULAR.

CHOLERA ON STEAMSHIP ARAGUAYA.

The steamship *Araguaya* sailed from Southampton September 30 and arrived at Pernambuco via Cherbourg about October 20 with a history of cholera on board. Consul Griffith at Pernambuco stated that many deaths were reported as having occurred on the vessel en route among third-class passengers. Two passengers by the *Araguaya* who were transhipped at Pernambuco to the steamship *Manaos* for Para died en route to that port, and Consul Pickerell at Para reported October 22 the removal of two cholera cases from the *Manaos* on the arrival of that vessel at Para. The *Araguaya* proceeded to Buenos Aires, where arrangements had been made for disinfection of the vessel on her arrival, and sailed for Montevideo October 29, leaving that port November 10 for Southampton.

ARABIA.

ADEN—Plague on Steamship Himalaya.

Consul Moser reports November 9:

Cases of plague are reported to have occurred on the steamship *Himalaya* bound from London to Bombay. The first cases developed between Gibraltar and Marseille. Three days after leaving Port Said 3 additional cases developed. These were landed at Aden October 23 and the vessel proceeded to Bombay.

CANADA.

MANITOBA—Infantile Paralysis in Western Canada.

Consul General Jones reports November 2:

Infantile paralysis has made its appearance in western Canada. During the past few months, 15 cases in all have been reported at Edmonton, Alberta, the ages of the victims being as follows: 1 year old, 1; 2 years old, 5; 4 years old, 1; 5 years old, 4; 6 years old, 1; 8 years old, 1; 10 years old, 1; 20 years old, 1; total, 15.

During the outbreak there were but 2 deaths, the ages being 2 years and 5 years. Nine of the cases originated in the city of Edmonton, and the remaining 6 were in the country. No new cases have been reported during the past two months except that of a 2-year-old child. This case terminated fatally.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.

SANTO DOMINGO—Trachoma among Immigrants.

Consul Russell reports, November 12:

Trachoma is very prevalent among Syrian immigrants who arrive on vessels from Marseille via Porto Rico. In one lodging house, in which there were 40 Syrians, 35 were found to be infected with trachoma. The health authorities have taken measures to prevent the landing of infected immigrants, and of 112 who arrived at Santo Domingo November 11 there were rejected for trachoma 80.

HAWAII.

Last case of human plague at Honolulu occurred July 12, 1910.

The last plague-infected rat was found at Aiea, 9 miles from Honolulu, April 12, 1910.

At Hilo the last case of human plague occurred March 23, 1910.

The last plague-infected rat was found at Piihuona, 4 miles from Hilo, April 9, 1910.

JAPAN.

Cholera and plague.

Acting Asst. Surg. Moore at Kobe reports November 4 and 9:

During the week ended October 29 there were reported in Kobe 82 cases of cholera with 47 deaths. During the week ended November 5 there were reported 12 cases of cholera with 12 deaths. The cholera situation at Kobe shows improvement. The total number of cases to November 5 is 362 with 195 deaths.

At Matsuyama 16 cases of plague were reported during the week ended November 5.

Sanitary Inspector Bowie at Nagasaki reports November 3 the occurrence of another case of cholera at Nagasaki. The case ended fatally.

MADEIRA ISLANDS.

FUNCHAL—Cholera.

The American chargé d'affaires at Lisbon, Portugal, reported, November 29, to the Department of State:

From November 17 to date 77 cases of cholera have been officially reported as occurring at Funchal.

RUSSIA.

ODESSA—Cholera Epidemic Terminated—Plague.

Consul Grout reports November 7 and 14:

There are no cholera cases in hospital and the epidemic of cholera in Odessa may be considered terminated. The total number of cases reported since the beginning of the outbreak is 604 with 340 deaths.

Plague.—On November 4 there were 11 cases of plague remaining in hospital.

During the week ended November 11 there was 1 new case of plague reported. At the close of the week there were 9 cases in hospital. From the beginning of the outbreak 134 cases with 39 deaths had been reported. Two cases of plague were reported in the village of Roksoliani in the county of Odessa, November 11.

TURKEY.

SALONIKI—Precautions Against Importation of Cholera.

Consul Horton reports November 7:

On account of the appearance of cholera at Adrianople, the sanitary commission of Saloniki has voted the following provisions:

Municipal physicians shall remain on all trains coming from Adrianople during the entire journey. No sick person shall be allowed to board the trains. Travelers from Adrianople shall be subjected to five days' surveillance. All mail from Adrianople shall be disinfected. Food products from Adrianople shall not be admitted into the vilayet of Saloniki. A disinfection depot shall be established at Drama. Houses shall be rented at the principal stations between Adrianople and Saloniki to harbor persons who show symptoms of cholera en route. Each train shall be furnished with a pharmacy for the use of the physicians. The railroad company must furnish only boiled water to the travelers. Quarantine will not at present be enforced.

VENEZUELA.

LA GUAIRA—Yellow Fever.

Acting Asst. Surg. Goldthwaite reports November 30:
Yellow fever present.

Plague at Caracas—Examination of Rats.

The American consul at La Guaira reports November 9:

During the week ended November 4 there were 10 cases of plague at Caracas. Of 144 rats examined 1 was found to be plague-infected. The rats were taken from various parts of the city.

ZANZIBAR.

ZANZIBAR—Smallpox—Examination of Rats.

Consul Weddell reports October 22:

During the two weeks ended October 16 there were reported 11 new cases of smallpox with 7 deaths. The total number of cases from June 8 to October 16 was 175, with 85 deaths; total number of vaccinations performed during the same period 23,256.

During the two weeks ended October 16, 2,307 rats were received and examined for plague infection. No plague-infected rats were found.
