#### PLAGUE-PREVENTION WORK

#### INFECTED GROUND SQUIRRELS

During the week ended December 31, 1910, the finding of 2 plague-infected ground squirrels was reported. The squirrels were found in Alameda County, Cal., 1 on December 21 at G. Enos ranch, 4½ miles northeast of Haywards, and 1 December 22 at M. J. Harlan ranch, 5½ miles northeast of Haywards.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF POISON

In connection with the making of a squirrel-free zone around the cities in California on San Francisco Bay, 205 acres of land in Alameda County were covered with poison during the week ended December 31, 1910.

#### AMOY-Plague Outbreaks in Vicinity

Acting Asst. Surg. Bonthius reports December 14 that severe outbreaks of plague, occurring both in the bubonic and pneumonic forms, were reported from the interior about 60 miles from Amoy.

#### SHANGHAI-Smallpox-Plague Rats

Acting Asst. Surg. Ransom reports December 14:

Smallpox has assumed almost epidemic proportions. Among foreigners 11 cases are reported present in hospital with additional cases scattered throughout the foreign settlement. The cases among natives are numerous, but no approximately accurate estimate of the number is obtainable.

There have been no cases of smallpox during the present epidemic among persons who had been successfully vaccinated within 3 years. There have been 2 mild cases among those unsuccessfully vaccinated about 9 months ago and successfully vaccinated a number of years previously. Two deaths occurred among persons successfully vaccinated in childhood but not vaccinated later, and 1 death of an unvaccinated person is reported.

Plague-infected rats are being found in considerable numbers.

#### AUSTRALIA

#### SYDNEY-Examination of Rats for Plague Infection

Brazil.—Ceara.—Month of October, 1910. Population, 50,000. Total number of deaths from all causes 123, including typhoid fever 7, measles 2, tuberculosis 16. Month of November, 1910. Total number of deaths 120, including typhoid fever 8, tuberculosis 12.

British Burma—Rangoon.—Month of October, 1910. Population, 301,259. Total number of deaths from all causes 686, including typhoid fever 5, cholera 1, smallpox 2, measles 4, plague 18, tuberculosis 24.

British Guiana—Paramaribo.—Month of November, 1910. Population, 36,496. Total number of deaths from all causes 67. No contagious diseases.

FRANCE—Marseille.—Month of November, 1910. Population, 517,498. Total number of deaths from all causes 750, including typhoid fever 26, measles 1, diphtheria 1, tuberculosis 111.

St. Etienne.—Two weeks ended November 30, 1910. Population, 150,000. Total number of deaths from all causes 120, including typhoid fever 1, measles 1, tuberculosis 16.

GREAT BRITAIN.—Week ended December 10, 1910.

England and Wales.—The deaths registered in 77 great towns correspond to an annual rate of 16.8 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 16,940,895.

Ireland.—The deaths registered in 21 principal town districts correspond to an annual rate of 19.6 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,151,790. The lowest rate was recorded at Queenstown, viz, 6.6, and the highest at Tralee, viz, 37 per 1,000.

Scotland. The deaths registered in 8 principal towns correspond to an annual rate of 17.2 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,891,936. The lowest rate was recorded at Aberdeen, viz, 14, and the highest at Dundee, viz, 23. The total number of deaths from all causes was 622, including typhoid fever 2, measles 2, scarlet fever 4, diphtheria 13.

ITALY—Genoa.—Two weeks ended November 15, 1910. Population, 279,163. Total number of deaths from all causes 226, including measles 2, tuberculosis 26.

Porto Rico.—Month of August, 1910. Population, 1,118,012. Total number of deaths from all causes 2,224, including typhoid fever 25, measles 13, tuberculosis 201. The service of tropical and
