URUGUAY—Montevideo.—Month of February, 1912. Population, 321,224. Total number of deaths from all causes 516, including diphtheria 2, measles 1, scarlet fever 1, tuberculosis 80, typhoid fever 11.

VENEZUELA—La Guaira.—Two weeks ended April 15, 1912. Population, 10,000. Total number of deaths from all causes 26, including tuberculosis 3, typhoid fever 1.
