EPIDEMIOLOGIC NOTES

MENINGOCOCCAL INFECTIONS

Seventy-two meningococcal infections were reported this week as compared to 87 for the similar period last year. The cumulative total of meningococcal infections reported thus far this year is 1,444 as compared to 1,135 through the 17th week last year. The median number reported for a comparable period during 1960-1964 is 896.
