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THE NOTIFIABLE DISEASES.

PREVALENCE DURING 1920 IN CITIES OF 10,000 TO 100,000.

ANTHRAX, CEREBROSPINAL MENINGITIS, DIPHTHERIA, INFLUENZA, MALARIA, MEASLES, PELLAGRA, PNEUMONIA, (ALL FORMS), POLIOMYELITIS (INFANTILE PARALYSIS), RABIES IN ANIMALS, RABIES IN MAN, SCARLET FEVER, SMALLPOX, TUBERCULOSIS (ALL FORMS AND PULMONARY), TYPHOID FEVER, AND TYPHUS FEVER—CASES AND DEATHS REPORTED, 1920; INDICATED CASE AND DEATH RATES PER 1,000 POPULATION; FATALITY RATES PER 100 CASES; AND MEDIAN NUMBER OF CASES REPORTED DURING PRECEDING YEARS.

The tables shown on the following pages were compiled from data furnished by the health officers of cities. Requests for information were sent to all cities of the United States having 10,000 population or more. The data for cities having more than 100,000 population were published in the PUBLIC HEALTH REPORTS, volume 36, No. 19, May 13, 1921. Similar data for States were published in the PUBLIC HEALTH REPORTS, volume 36, No. 31, August 5, 1921.

The present article contains reports from cities having between 10,000 and 100,000 population which responded to the request for information. It is believed that practically all cities are included which have records of morbidity from communicable diseases which are of value for statistical purposes.

The populations given and which were used in computing the rates were estimated as of July 1, 1920, from the preliminary reports of the census of January 1, 1920, and the reports of the census of April 15, 1910. The figures given probably differ somewhat from estimates which will be made later, which will be based on the final reports of the 1920 census and will take into consideration changes in area of the cities between 1910 and 1920, data for which are not now available. The differences, however, will probably not be such as to seriously affect the rates given in the tables.

Medians¹ of the total number of cases reported annually during the years 1914 to 1919 are given for cerebrospinal meningitis, diphtheria, measles, poliomyelitis (infantile paralysis), scarlet fever, smallpox, and typhoid fever. The column headed "Number of years" shows the number of years for which data were available. For pellagra, data were available only for the years 1915 to 1919, inclusive.

¹ The median has been defined as the magnitude of the middle item in an array. If the number of cases reported are arranged so that the greatest number reported in any one year is first, the second greatest number is second, and so on, then the number of cases in the center of the array is the median. The following illustration shows the method followed when data for five years are available: In a city reporting 60 cases in 1915, 79 cases in 1916, 71 cases in 1917, 58 cases in 1918, and 63 cases in 1919, the median is 60 cases.

For all diseases except anthrax, rabies, and typhus fever, there is given either the fatality rate per 100 cases or the number of cases reported for each death registered.

In comparing the figures for 1920 with the medians for preceding years, it should be borne in mind that there has been a gradual improvement in the reporting of communicable diseases during the last few years. An increase in the number of cases reported may be due to better reporting of the particular disease rather than to an increase in the number of cases existing.

In studying these tables it should be kept in mind that a relatively large number of reported cases of a communicable disease as indicated by a high case rate (and more especially when accompanied by a relatively small number of deaths, as indicated by a low fatality rate) usually means that the health department of that city is active and that the cases of the disease are being well reported by the practicing physicians. It does not usually mean that the disease is more prevalent in that city than in other cities. A high fatality rate may mean that the disease was unusually virulent in a city, that the physicians did not treat the disease in that city with the success usual elsewhere, or that the practicing physicians did not report all of their cases to the health department. On the other hand, an unusually low fatality rate may be due to the fact that the disease in the city was unusually mild, that the physicians treated it with unusual success, that the practicing physicians reported their cases satisfactorily, or that the registration of deaths was incomplete or the assignment of the causes of death inaccurate.

Cities in which no cases of a certain disease were reported are not included in the table for that disease.

FOREIGN AND INSULAR.

ALGERIA.

Plague—Aumale District.¹

According to information dated September 7, 1921, the only locality in Algeria which remained plague infected to that date was the Douar Megnine, situated 18 kilometers from Aumale and 140 kilometers from Algiers. From the beginning of the outbreak, May 31, 1921, to August 24, there were reported 185 cases of plague with 97 deaths in the district.

BOLIVIA.

Typhus Fever—La Paz.

Information has been received showing the occurrence of typhus fever at La Paz, Bolivia, as follows: Month of May, 1921, 8 cases with 5 deaths; month of June, 1921, 10 cases with 7 deaths; month of July, 1921, 19 cases with 3 deaths.

BRITISH HONDURAS.

Yellow Fever—Belize.

A death from yellow fever was reported at Belize, British Honduras, September 17, 1921.

CHINA.

Cholera—Shanghai.

During the week ended August 21, 1921, 5 foreign cases and 14 Chinese cases of cholera were bacteriologically verified at the laboratory of Shanghai, China.

GREECE.

Plague—Piræus.

Three cases of plague were reported, September 23, 1921, at Piræus, Greece.

JAMAICA.

Infectious Disease (Alastrim or Kaffir Pox).

During the week ended August 27, 1921, 58 new cases of alastrim or Kaffir pox were reported in the Island of Jamaica.

Typhoid Fever—Kingston and Vicinity.

During the week ended August 27, 1921, 10 cases of typhoid fever were reported in Kingston and 15 cases in the surrounding country.

MAURITIUS.**Plague—Port Louis.**

Plague was reported present at Port Louis, Island of Mauritius, August 24, 1921.

MEXICO.**Yellow Fever—Manzanillo.**

During the week ended September 9, 1921, a case of yellow fever was reported at Manzanillo, Mexico. A total of 18 cases and 10 deaths was reported from June 1 to September 9, 1921.

PORTO RICO.**Plague-Infected Rodent—Fajardo.**

The finding of a plague-infected rat at Fajardo, Porto Rico, was reported during the week ended September 3, 1921.

UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA.**Plague—Smallpox—Typhus Fever—January-April, 1921.**

Information has been received under date of June 16, 1921, showing the occurrence of plague, smallpox, and typhus fever in the Union of South Africa during the months of January, February, March, and April, 1921, as follows:

Plague.—During the period under report 6 cases of plague with 4 deaths were reported among the white population and 13 cases with 6 deaths among the natives. The cases all occurred in the Orange Free State and during the months of January, March, and April, 1921.

Smallpox.—During the period under report, 18 cases of smallpox with 1 death were reported among the white population of the Union of South Africa, and 192 cases with 5 deaths among the native population. Of the cases reported, 140 occurred in the Cape Province and the Transvaal.

Typhus fever.—During the period under report 34 cases of typhus fever with 2 deaths were reported among the white population and 3,376 cases with 437 deaths among the native population of the Union of South Africa. The cases and deaths were distributed according to months as follows:

January—White, 4 cases; native, 1,198 cases, 206 deaths. February—White, 6 cases; native, 925 cases, 99 deaths. March—White, 11 cases; native, 676 cases, 74 deaths. April—White, 13 cases, 2 deaths; native, 577 cases, 58 deaths.

Typhus Fever—June, 1921:

During the month of June, 1921, 738 cases of typhus fever with 66 deaths were reported in the Union of South Africa. Of these, 708 cases and all the fatalities reported occurred in the Cape Province. Five cases were reported in Natal and 25 cases in the Orange Free State. (For report for month of May, 1921, see Public Health Reports, Sept. 16, 1921, p. 2293.)
