SICKNESS AMONG OFFICE WORKERS.¹

A YEAR'S EXPERIENCE OF A LARGE MANUFACTURING COMPANY WHICH RECORDED THE NUMBER OF HOURS WHICH EACH OFFICE EMPLOYEE LOST FROM WORK ON ACCOUNT OF SICKNESS AND ACCIDENTS.

Through the courtesy of the medical research department of a large corporation in the Middle West, there is presented here the morbidity experience of the company's home office employees during the year ending January 31, 1921. The average number on the office pay roll during this period was 1,282, with women in the majority. A record was kept of the hours lost from work by each person on account of sickness and injuries. The data were obtained when the employee checked in through the medical department after absence for any cause. The illnesses causing disability were diagnosed by the medical department or the family physician. Since an attempt was made to include every hour lost from work on account of disability, it is believed that these data are more exact than any ever before published in this country for an industrial group of more than 1,000 persons.

AMOUNT OF DISABILITY.

The committee on industrial waste of the Federated American Engineering Societies, appointed in January, 1921, by Herbert Hoover, has reported that "the 42,000,000 men and women gainfully employed [in this country] probably lose on an average more than eight days each annually from illness disabilities."² The recorded morbidity of 1,282 office workers shows an annual rate of 8.15 days lost from work per person. Is this rate representative of the average amount of disabling illness experienced by the adult working population in the United States? There are at least two factors which would tend to make the sickness rate in question higher than the average: (1) The majority of the office workers were women, whereas

the number of men usually exceeds the number of women employed; and (2) an influenza epidemic causing a loss of nearly two days of work per person occurred during the year in which the records were kept. On the other hand, there are at least three factors which would tend to make the illness rate lower than the average rate for the gainfully employed: (1) The average age of the office employees was only 23.7 years; (2) clerical and executive work is relatively free from health hazards; and (3) the health of the group was safeguarded by well-organized medical supervision. Age is an important factor; it has been found that except for epidemics and other unusual conditions, the age distribution of a group may account for the amount of time lost to an extent greater than any other single cause. With due allowance for these several factors it would seem from what little evidence we have that the estimate of the committee on waste is not an overstatement of the actual time lost from work on account of disabling diseases and accidents.³

During the year there were approximately two cases of disabling sickness per person which, curiously enough, is the number that every company with comparable morbidity data has thus far reported. The average number of working days lost per case was 3.8.

CAUSES OF DISPENSARY CALLS AND OF ACTUAL DISABILITY.

The dispensaries of industrial companies are established primarily for the treatment of accidents and minor ills and for consultations over symptoms of ill health about which employees desire advice. It is assumed that the time lost from work will be diminished if diseases are recognized in their incipency and appropriate treatment is administered. It is therefore of interest to compare the number of dispensary calls which each disease or symptom occasioned with the actual time lost on account of each disease. In Table I, under the different headings for specific disease groups, the illnesses are listed in order of the frequency of dispensary calls and then in order of the frequency of cases of actual disability. When the same disease caused absence from work as well as dispensary visits, the name of the disease is not shown twice, but its place on the list is determined by the number of calls to the dispensary. The causes of dispensary calls represent the diagnosis of the nurse in attendance at the dispensary. Most of the calls, of course, were occasioned by symptoms of sickness; but knowledge of the prevalence of certain symptoms is highly important.

A comparison of the figures in the first two columns of Table I illustrates the value of early treatment in preventing disability. Over 9 per cent of all dispensary calls was due to minor infections, yet not a single case of disability from purulent infection developed. This seems remarkable when comparison is made with the morbidity experience of other industrial groups.⁴ Continuing inspection of the table, we find that there were only four cases of tuberculosis, five of pneumonia, and three of appendicitis. The small loss of time from the myalgias might be accounted for by the large number of young people in the organization, the average age, as mentioned before, being only 23.7 years. Except for influenza, there were no epidemics of consequence.

It is of interest to observe whether the diseases and conditions occasioning the largest number of dispensary calls caused also the largest amount of disability. Colds, rhinitis, headache, and sore throat constituted 35 per cent of all calls to the dispensary, whereas colds, septic throat, and headache, plus their more serious developments (influenza, grippe, pneumonia, laryngitis, and tonsillitis), were responsible for 41 per cent of total time lost on account of sickness. Indigestion induced 5.4 per cent of total dispensary calls and contributed 4.5 per cent of all time lost on account of disabling illness.

Dysmenorrhea caused approximately 5 per cent of dispensary calls and the same percentage of absenteeism. These relationships suggest that an appropriate proportion of the industrial physician's time must have been devoted to treatment of the common ailments responsible for the greatest amount of disability.

In Table II the departments are listed in order of the number of days of absence from work per employee. In general, the departments employing the largest proportion of men exhibit the lowest illness rates, and those composed entirely of women have the highest rates. Sex is a considerable factor in disability.

DURATION OF THE 15 MOST FREQUENT CAUSES OF DISABILITY.

The figures for the 15 most frequent causes of disability displayed in Table III and Figure 1 gauge the losses in time which the annoying petty ills occasioned. One out of every three persons had a cold severe enough to incapacitate for work, the average duration of absence due to colds being one and one-half days. This is equivalent to the loss of one-half of a working day by each employee on the pay roll. Though influenza and grippe were not quite so prevalent as colds, they caused a time loss four times as great. Fatigue caused a surprising amount of disability from the standpoint of duration as well as number of cases. The severity rate was three-quarters of a day per person on the pay roll. The average duration of nearly 12 working days per case of fatigue was by far the longest of any of the 15 most frequent causes of disability. The situation suggests an opportunity for reducing the amount of disability from fatigue by a study of the cases that occurred.

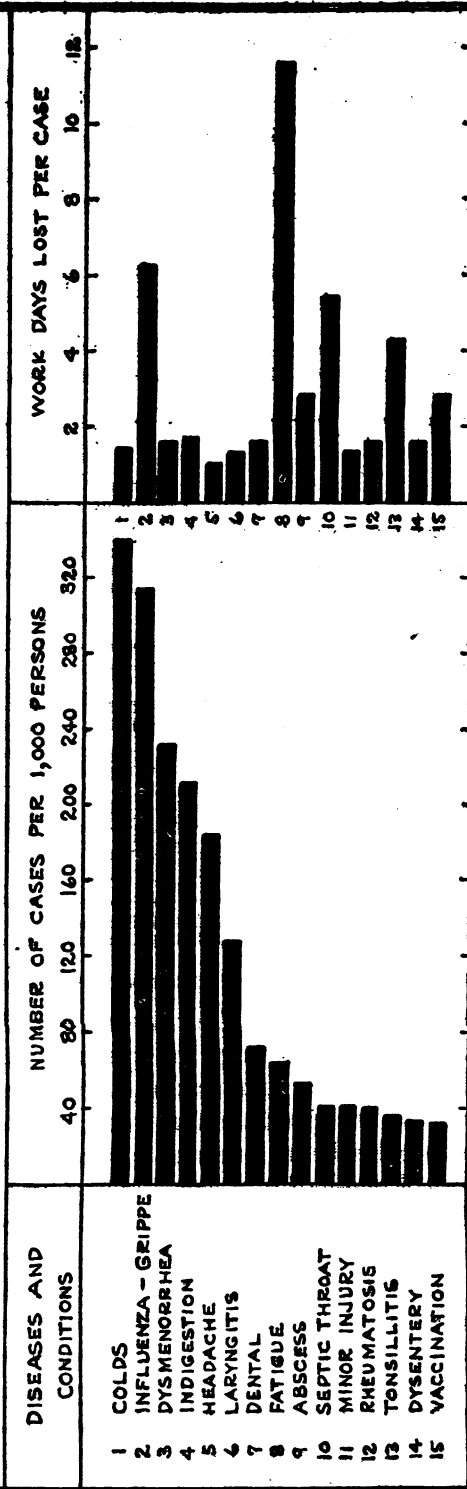

DEATHS FROM INFLUENZA AND PNEUMONIA COMBINED.

COMPARISON OF THE FIRST NINE WEEKS OF THE YEARS 1919-1922, INCLUSIVE, FOR CERTAIN LARGE CITIES OF THE UNITED STATES.

The accompanying table gives the number of reported deaths from influenza and pneumonia (all forms), combined, during the first nine weeks of the years 1919, 1920, 1921, and 1922, in 36 large cities of the United States.

This is a continuation of the table printed on pages 459-461 of the Public Health Reports of March 3, 1922 (vol. 37, No. 9).

The weeks for which figures are given all ended on Saturday, the "first" week for each year ending on the following days, respectively: January 4, 1919, January 10, 1920, January 8, 1921, and January 7, 1922.

The figures for 1919 and 1920 were taken from the Weekly Health Index, issued by the Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce, supplemented by reports to the Public Health Service. For 1921 and 1922 the figures are taken from reports made by the city health officers to the Public Health Service.

Blanks in the table indicate that no reports of deaths from influenza or pneumonia were received for the week. This does not always indicate that no deaths from these diseases occurred.

FOREIGN AND INSULAR.

AUSTRALIA.

Plague—Sydney.

During the week ended February 25, 1922, two cases of plague were reported at Sydney, Australia.

AUSTRIA.

Influenza—Vienna.

During the week ended January 21, 1922, 781 cases of influenza were reported at Vienna, Austria. (Population, census of January 31, 1922, 1,842,005.)

CANADA.

Proposed Department of Public Health—Quebec.

According to information dated February 8, 1922, it is proposed to establish a public health department for the Province of Quebec. Under the provisions of the act to this effect to be submitted to the provincial legislature, a superintendent of public health will be appointed who will be the head of a health branch under the jurisdiction of the provincial secretary, who is a member of the provincial cabinet. The public health service of the Province was stated to be at present in charge of a superior board of health composed of physicians, some of whom are members of the legislature.

The Government's estimate for health work for 1922 in the Province was stated to be \$200,000.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.

Smallpox.¹

Information relative to the prevalence of smallpox in the Dominican Republic, received under date of February 7, 1922, shows that during the month of October, 1921, there were 653 cases with 54 deaths.

It is reported that the disease broke out during the summer of 1921 in epidemic form along the Haitian-Dominican border, and that the frontier was immediately closed and the inhabitants of this zone were subjected to compulsory vaccination. This measure is stated to have proved very effective, and the disease is said to have left the frontier and to have traveled eastward. During January and the first week in February it was particularly severe in the Provinces of Puerta Plata, Santiago, La Vega, and Santo Domingo.

According to information dated January 31, 1922, the number of cases present in the Puerta Plata district was estimated at about 20,000, with more than 1,000 deaths. At Puerta Plata more than 400 cases were reported with more than 20 deaths (population, 7,500). At Santiago, with a population of 15,000, 2,000 cases were reported and more than 100 deaths. Statistics of prevalence of smallpox in the smaller towns and rural districts have not been received, but it was stated that the disease was as prevalent and as virulent as in the larger centers.

It was stated that early in the month of January, 1922, the supply of vaccine in the Republic became exhausted, and several weeks elapsed before fresh stocks could be secured.

Economic conditions are reported to be distressing in the north central part of the Republic, and the opinion is expressed by persons connected with the Department of Sanitation that lack of sufficient nourishing food has reduced the resistance of many of the people of this section.

FINLAND.

Influenza.

During the period January 1 to 15, 1922, 7,300 cases of influenza were reported in Finland. (Population, officially estimated, 3,325,814).

Sleeping Sickness (Lethargic encephalitis).

During the years 1920 and 1921, there were reported in Finland a number of cases of sleeping sickness. The disease increased very rapidly in prevalence. During the last two weeks in December, 1920, about 38 cases were reported; in 1921, 96 cases with 17 deaths were reported.

GERMANY.

Influenza—Bremen.

Influenza was reported present at Bremen, Germany, during the month of December, 1921, with 21 deaths, and during the first three weeks of January, 1922, with 61 deaths, of which the greater number occurred early in the month.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Influenza—Cardiff, Wales.

Influenza was reported present in epidemic form, January 24, 1922, at Cardiff, Wales. The form of the disease was stated to be mild.

Measles—Glasgow.

During the week ended February 4, 1922, 631 cases of measles with 76 deaths were reported at Glasgow.

GREECE.**Plague—Preveza.**

Under date of February 8, 1922, an outbreak of plague was reported in Greece, occurring at Preveza, a port on the Ionian sea, situated about 60 miles north of Patras and 25 miles south of the Island of Corfu.

MAURITIUS.**Plague—Port Louis—October—November, 1921.**

Plague was reported present at Port Louis, Island of Mauritius, during the week ended November 5, 1921, with 37 cases, of which 31 ended fatally.¹ Later reports show a total of 159 cases with 101 deaths, occurring during the period October 29 to November 30, 1921, and the finding of 176 plague-infected rats and 36 plague-infected cats.

Plague in rats was reported at Port Louis in May and June, 1921, June 27, two cases of plague with one death were reported; August 24, plague was reported present.²

PERU.**Plague—January 1-15, 1922.**

During the period January 1 to 15, 1922, 28 cases of plague with 12 deaths were reported in Peru. The cases were distributed in 12 localities.

POLAND.**Communicable Diseases—Oct. 9-Dec. 3, 1921.**

Communicable diseases have been reported in Poland, exclusive of the districts of Brest-Litovsk, Minsk, and Wilno, as follows:
