## SANITARY ENGINEERING COURSES OF ENGINEERING COLLEGES IN THE UNITED STATES.

For several years past, inquiries have been received by the Surgeon General of the United States Public Health Service for information as to the colleges in the United States giving sanitary engineering courses, the subjects included in such courses, the number of graduates, etc. In order that reliable data regarding these topics might be made available, a letter was sent, in January, 1923, to 129 engineering colleges in the United States<sup>1</sup> containing the following queries:

1. Does your department include a complete course in sanitary engineering?
2. If so, when was it established?
3. What are the degrees granted?
4. What subjects are included in the course of sanitary engineering leading to such degrees?
5. What is the number of graduates, by years?

It was necessary to send a follow-up letter in February, 1923. As a result, replies were received from 126 colleges. In February, 1924, another letter was sent, but only to those engineering colleges in which, according to the replies received in 1923, regular or optional courses in sanitary engineering were offered. In this letter, additional information was sought with which a reliable comparison could be made between the sanitary engineering and civil engineering courses. The compiled data were sent to each college in Table 1 for review, and the replies were incorporated in the tables as finally presented.

The compilation of the data disclosed that many colleges had adhered closely to the questions of the first letter and those not giving sanitary engineering courses had replied in the negative without

qualifying their replies as to whether they included any sanitary engineering subjects in their other engineering courses. Those colleges which offered sanitary engineering courses differed considerably in their unit of work, the "hour," "point," "credit," or "course" being used for a basis. Where electives were permitted in the courses, it was the plan to credit them to the proper subject groups according to the best available information. Unless definite information was furnished, a blank space was left in the table.

It is of particular interest at this time, when various definitions of the sanitary engineer are being proposed, to note the following section from the 1922 catalogue of Columbia University, in which the scope and the field of usefulness of the sanitary engineer are extended considerably beyond that now usually recognized, and, at the same time, his work is defined in a clearer manner:

"The sanitary engineer must not only be able to design and construct water-purification plants and sewage-disposal systems, but he must understand the chemical and biological processes upon which the successful operation of these plants is based. He must not only be able to construct such engineering features as will prevent epidemics and further the health and comfort of individuals and communities, but he must have a knowledge of bacteriology, sanitary statistics, and the sources and modes of infection.

"While mathematics, mechanics, and physics are the theoretical basis for the work of the civil engineer in design, construction, and management, the sanitary engineer adds to these the collateral sciences of chemistry and biology."

Through the courtesy of Prof. Charles Gilman Hyde, of the University of California, the following interesting information appearing on a circular issued for the benefit of visitors to the university on "Engineers' Day" is presented:

With reference to the foregoing tables it can be seen that up to and including 1917, the year of the World War, the number of sanitary engineering graduates in American colleges increased steadily. The effect of the war upon the number of these graduates is shown with telling effect in the sudden and sharp reduction in 1918. Since then this number has increased gradually. The number of sanitary engineers to graduate in 1924 will be 37, as compared with 69, the number that graduated in 1917.

Considering only the colleges of Table No. 1 (a) and omitting Columbia and Harvard, in which the courses are longer than in the other colleges, the averages of percentages of time allotted to subject groups given in Table 2 for each college course are as follows:

From these averages one finds, in a comparison of sanitary engineering and civil engineering courses, that about 10 per cent of the time allotted to allied engineering subjects in the civil engineering curriculum is replaced largely by sanitary engineering subjects and partly by pure science subjects (chemistry and biology) in the sanitary engineering course. In general, in both courses about one-half the curriculum time is spent on allied engineering subjects, about one-third on pure science subjects, and the other one-sixth of the time on cultural and sanitary engineering subjects, the last covering the least amount of time.

From Table 3 it is seen that the sanitary engineering course in the majority of the colleges includes the following subjects: (1) *Cultural*—economics, English, languages; (2) *pure science*—chemistry, geology, mathematics, physics; (3) *allied engineering*—drawing, electrical engineering, heat engineering, hydraulics, materials, mechanics, railroad engineering, roads and pavements, structures, surveying; (4) *sanitary engineering*—municipal sanitation, sanitary laboratory, sewerage and sewage disposal, water works and water treatment; (5) *public health*; (6) *miscellaneous*—gymnasium. In the majority of the colleges the civil engineering course differs in subjects given from the sanitary engineering course as follows: (1) cultural—business law instead of language; (4) sanitary engineering—municipal sanitation and sanitary laboratory omitted. It is of interest to note that (1) biology in its broadest aspects is given by eight colleges in the sanitary engineering course and seven colleges in the civil engineering course; (2) municipal sanitation is offered in the civil engineering course in seven colleges; and (3) sanitary science and public health is included in the sanitary engineering course in five colleges, and in the civil engineering course in four colleges.

In many of the colleges it is noted that certain cultural and pure science subjects are given which are required for entrance into other colleges. It would seem that, through universal establishment of stricter entrance requirements and the giving of these subjects in the high and college preparatory schools, more time would be allotted for advanced professional subjects in the college curriculum. This may do away with the necessity for increasing the present length of the college course, a tendency which is becoming more and more evident. It would logically seem that what is needed first of all, before the sanitary engineering course is lengthened, is an overhauling and rearranging of the precollege and college courses to make them conform in a more practical way with the actual work that sanitary engineers perform after leaving college.

Table 4 shows that the large majority of the sanitary engineering courses are four years in length leading to a B. S. (civil engineering) or a B. S. (sanitary engineering). The other degrees are Bachelor of Engineering, Civil Engineer, and M. S. (sanitary engineering). The name of the course is generally sanitary engineering, but in four colleges it is sanitary and municipal engineering.

#### CONCLUSIONS.

1. There are ten colleges in the United States now offering full courses in sanitary engineering; namely, Columbia University, Harvard University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Pennsylvania State College, State University of Iowa, University of California, University of Illinois, University of Michigan, University of Texas, and Villanova College.
2. Four other colleges are now offering optional courses in sanitary engineering, namely, Iowa State College, University of Kansas, University of North Carolina, and West Virginia University.

3. Of the other engineering colleges in the country, at least 55 are including in their courses the following subjects: Water supply and waterworks, and sewerage and sewage disposal.

4. The number of graduates from sanitary engineering courses in engineering colleges of the United States increased steadily until 1918, when the World War caused a sudden and sharp drop; since then the number has increased gradually. In 1924 the number will be at least 37, as compared with 69 in 1917.

5. According to the average of the regular sanitary engineering courses now offered, the time is allotted to subject groups as follows: (1) cultural, 14.2 per cent; (2) pure science, 32.2 per cent; (3) allied engineering, 41.1 per cent; (4) sanitary engineering, 9.8 per cent; (5) public health, 0.4 per cent; (6) miscellaneous, 2.3 per cent.

6. The sanitary engineering course differs from the civil engineering course as now given in the engineering colleges of the country mainly in that about 6 per cent more time is allotted to sanitary engineering subjects and 4 per cent more time to chemistry and biology, instead of allied engineering subjects.

7. The regular sanitary engineering course includes the following subjects: (1) cultural—economics, English, languages; (2) pure science—chemistry, geology, mathematics, physics; (3) allied engineering—drawing, electrical engineering, heat engineering, hydraulics, materials, mechanics, railroad engineering, roads and pavements, structures, surveying; (4) sanitary engineering—municipal sanitation, sanitary laboratory, sewerage and sewage disposal, waterworks and water supply; (5) miscellaneous—gymnasium.

8. The degrees conferred upon graduates from sanitary engineering courses are: B. S. (civil engineering), B. S. (sanitary engineering), M. S. (sanitary engineering), Bachelor of Engineering, and Civil Engineer.

9. The courses are generally four years in length, although one course is five years and another is six years.

10. The course is generally known as sanitary engineering, although in four colleges it is called sanitary and municipal engineering.

It may be that this paper, by disseminating the foregoing data on sanitary engineering courses of engineering colleges in the United States as at present constituted, will bring about a cooperative effort of sanitarians and university faculties with the idea of improving, extending, and making more uniform the courses in sanitary engineering offered at the colleges.

### LOCATING THE SOURCE OF INFECTION.

The following extract, originally from the Journal of Social Hygiene for June, 1924, is reproduced from the Health Officers' Weekly Bulletin, New Mexico State Department of Health. Comment seems unnecessary.

"It is a city of approximately 20,000 population. Its citizens are proud of their schools, their churches, their business organizations, and their health and police protection. The city is located in a busy and enterprising state where public welfare is given more than average consideration.

"And yet, with all these advantages, 21 men and boys were found infected with gonorrhea in this city and environs within a few days, and all admitted having contracted it at a house of prostitution, located a short distance outside of the city limits. These 21 cases are known, but the chances are that there are many more attributable to the same source. Some of the 21 were infected weeks ago. All were willing to tell the source of their infection but, prior to the sending of an employee of the State Department of Health into the city, not one had been asked where he contracted this disease.

"The State police were called on and they proceeded to put the roadhouse out of business; but in the meantime what a fearful toll was paid because the city health authorities and the private physicians who had treated some of the cases failed to observe a primary public health axiom. As a health officer of the State said, 'An epidemic of gonorrhea could have been avoided if the city health authorities had taken the logical and essential first step of locating the source of infection.'

### HISTORY OF MEDICAL PRACTICE IN ILLINOIS.

Under the sponsorship of the Illinois State Medical Society, there is now being prepared "A History of Medical Practice in the State of Illinois," which is to be a comprehensive historical record, in narrative and pictorial form, of 250 years of medical practice in the State, beginning with the accounts of the physicians who accompanied the early explorers in that section of the country and continuing in historical sequence down to modern times.

It is the purpose of the compilers to go to original sources for the early historical material, and they are making an effort to get in

touch with all physicians who were former residents of Illinois and with persons who are descendants of pioneer physicians, many of whom, no doubt, are in possession of valuable original data such as diaries, photographs, and similar personal material the value of which would be greatly enhanced by being incorporated in such a history. ## THE NOTIFIABLE DISEASES.

### PREVALENCE DURING 1923 IN CITIES OF 10,000 TO 100,000 POPULATION.

The tables shown on the following pages were compiled from data furnished by the health officers of cities. Requests for information were sent to all cities of the United States having 10,000 population

or more. The data for cities having more than 100,000 population were published in the PUBLIC HEALTH REPORTS, volume 39, No. 28, July 11, 1924.

The present article contains reports from cities having between 10,000 and 100,000 population. It is believed that practically all of these cities are included which have records of morbidity from communicable diseases which are of value for statistical purposes.

The estimated expectancy, given in the tables for some of the diseases, is the result of an attempt to ascertain from the experience of recent years how many cases of the disease under consideration might be expected in 1923. In most instances the estimated expectancy is the median number of cases reported by the city for the years 1916 to 1922, inclusive. When several epidemics have occurred during these years, or when for other reasons the median is not satisfactory, epidemic years are excluded, and the estimated expectancy is the mean of the number of cases reported for the non-epidemic years. The aim has been to ascertain how many cases of each disease may reasonably be expected in the absence of epidemics.

The column headed "Number of years" shows the number of years for which data are available for each city.

For all diseases except anthrax, lethargic encephalitis, rabies, and Rocky Mountain spotted fever there is given either the fatality rate per 100 cases or the number of cases reported for each death registered.

In comparing the figures for 1923 with the estimated expectancy or with reports for preceding years, it should be borne in mind that there has been a gradual improvement in the reporting of communicable diseases during the last few years. An increase in the number of cases reported may be due to better reporting of the particular disease rather than to an increase in the number of cases existing.

In studying these tables it should be kept in mind that a relatively large number of reported cases of a communicable disease as indicated by a high case rate (and more especially when accompanied by a relatively small number of deaths, as indicated by a low fatality rate) usually means that the health department of that city is active

and that the cases of the disease are being well reported by the practicing physicians. It does not usually mean that the disease is more prevalent in that city than in other cities. A high fatality rate may mean that the disease was unusually virulent in a city, that the physicians did not treat the disease in that city with the success usual elsewhere, or that the practicing physicians did not report all of their cases to the health department. On the other hand, an unusually low fatality rate may be due to the fact that the disease in the city was unusually mild, that the physicians treated it with unusual success, that the practicing physicians reported their cases satisfactorily, or that the registration of deaths was incomplete or the assignment of the causes of death inaccurate.

Cities which did not report either cases or deaths of a certain disease in 1923 are not included in the table for that disease.

**GENERAL CURRENT SUMMARY AND WEEKLY REPORTS FROM CITIES.**

*Diphtheria.*—For the week ended July 26, 1924, 34 States reported 1,036 cases of diphtheria. For the week ended July 28, 1923, the same States reported 1,078 cases of diphtheria. One hundred and two cities, situated in all parts of the country and having an aggregate population of more than 28,600,000, reported 552 cases of diphtheria for the week ended July 26, 1924. Last year for the corresponding week they reported 550 cases. The estimated expectancy for these cities was 608 cases. The estimated expectancy was based on the experience of the last nine years, excluding epidemics.

*Measles.*—Twenty-eight States reported 1,270 cases of measles for the week this year, and 2,901 cases for the week last year. One hundred and two cities reported 523 cases of measles for the week this year, and 741 cases last year.

*Scarlet fever.*—Scarlet fever was reported for the week as follows: Thirty-four States—this year, 827 cases; last year, 828 cases. One hundred and two cities—this year, 338 cases; last year, 335 cases; estimated expectancy, 264 cases.

*Smallpox.*—For the week ended July 5, 1924, 34 States reported 398 cases of smallpox. Last year for the corresponding week they reported 270 cases. One hundred and two cities reported smallpox for the week as follows: 1924, 107 cases; 1923, 62 cases; estimated expectancy, 43 cases.

*Typhoid fever.*—Six hundred and forty-eight cases of typhoid fever were reported for the week ended July 26, 1924, by 33 States. For the corresponding week of 1923, the number was 771 cases. One hundred and two cities reported 188 cases for the week this year and 201 cases for the week last year. The estimated expectancy for these cities was 185 cases.

*Influenza and pneumonia.*—Deaths from influenza and pneumonia (combined) were reported for the week by 102 cities as follows: 1924, 303 deaths; 1923, 306 deaths.

**City reports for week ended July 28, 1924.**

The "estimated expectancy" given for diphtheria, poliomyelitis, scarlet fever, smallpox, and typhoid fever is the result of an attempt to ascertain from previous occurrences how many cases of the disease under consideration may be expected to occur during a certain week in the absence of epidemics. It is based on reports to the Public Health Service during the past nine years. It is in most instances the median number of cases reported in the corresponding week of the preceding years. When the reports include several epidemics, or when for other reasons the median is unsatisfactory, the epidemic periods are excluded and the estimated expectancy is the mean number of cases reported for the week during nonepidemic years.

If reports have not been received for the full nine years, data are used for as many years as possible, but no year earlier than 1915 is included. In obtaining the estimated expectancy, the figures are smoothed when necessary to avoid abrupt deviations from the usual trend. For some of the diseases given in the table the available data were not sufficient to make it practicable to compute the estimated expectancy.

## FOREIGN AND INSULAR.

### CHOLERA ON VESSEL.

Steamship "Argalia"—At Bassein, Lower Burma.

On June 8, 1924, the steamship *Argalia* arrived at Durban, Union of South Africa, with a history of having had a case of cholera on board in a European member of the crew while the vessel was lying at Bassein, Lower Burma, India. It was stated that the patient was landed and removed to hospital on the same date and that all possible measures were taken by the authorities at Bassein to prevent spread of the infection. The vessel was considered to be free from infection on arriving at Durban.

### PLAQUE ON VESSEL.

Steamship "Amboise"—At Marseille, France.

The steamship *Amboise* was reported detained at Frioul quarantine station, Marseille, France, July 10, 1924, with a case of plague on board, which was removed to the station hospital. The case occurred in a fireman, an Arab, who was embarked at Aden, Arabia, and was stated to have been sick at the time of embarkation. The patient was taken definitely ill at Port Said, Egypt, but was not disembarked. A second fireman found to have temperature was isolated at the quarantine station at Marseille, 240 members of crew were quartered in the buildings on the Island of Ratonneau and 400 passengers were given sanitary passports requiring report to be made within five days to designated authorities. Vaccine was given to 120 of the detained crew, vaccination being optional.

The *Amboise* left Yokohama, Japan, May 30, for Marseille, and sailed from Colombo, Ceylon, June 22, 1924.

### CEYLON.

#### Typhoid Fever Death Rates—1911-1923.

Information received under date of June 12, 1924, shows typhoid fever death rates per 100,000 population in the Island of Ceylon during the period 1911 to 1923 as follows:

It was stated that the figures for the years prior to 1911 were not comparable with those of subsequent years owing to change of classification. Cases formerly returned as "enteric" are now classed under fevers and no case is tabulated by the Ceylon department of vital statistics unless certified to by medical authority.

#### Colombo Water Supply.

The water supply of Colombo, Ceylon, is obtained from the Labugama Reservoir which is situated 28 miles from Colombo and in an area of 2,500 acres of woodland, free from cultivation and habitation. The original installment dates from 1886. A filtration plant using gravity filters was installed in 1912. Ten of these filters, with a capacity of eight million gallons a day, were stated to be in use. The water passes from the reservoir into a settling basin where a coagulant is used.

#### Milk Supply.

The milk supply of the city was stated to be safeguarded by the local authorities, with frequent inspections of the various sources of supply.

#### CHINA.

##### Status of Plague—Foochow.

According to information dated June 13, 1924, the annual spring recurrence of plague in Foochow and vicinity has been in slightly milder form than is usual. This improvement is attributed to more general use of preventive inoculation. The prevalence was stated not to have reached epidemic proportions during the current year. During the month of May, 13 deaths from plague were reported, and from June 1 to 13, four deaths. The number of reported cases was not stated.

#### EGYPT.

##### Status of Plague.

During the week ended July 1, 1924, seven cases of plague were reported in Egypt. Of these, two cases occurred in the city of Suez, the remaining five cases being distributed in three districts. During the period January 1 to July 1, 1924, 320 cases of plague were reported in Egypt as compared with 1,110 cases reported during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

#### GREECE.

##### Plague—Kalamata—Saloniki.

Information received under date of July 15, 1924, shows the occurrence of 29 cases of plague with 6 deaths at Kalamata, Greece. The first case, with fatal termination, occurred in a house in which a number of refugee families were living. The remaining persons living in the house were isolated; but of the number, 28 persons were

attacked, with 5 fatalities. Strict measures for disinfecting the city and destroying rats were stated to have been taken.

At Saloniki, on July 3 and 4, 1924, two cases of plague developed among dock workmen employed in handling flour imported from the United States and Canada. No infection was reported among the shipping, and it was believed that the infection originated in the customs warehouses. It was stated that effective sanitary measures were being enforced.

#### JAMAICA.

##### **Smallpox (Reported as Alastrim).**

During the week ended July 19, 1924, 60 new cases of smallpox (reported as alastrim) were notified in the island of Jamaica. Of these, one case was notified in the parish of Kingston.

#### Chicken Pox.

During the same period four new cases of chicken pox were notified in the island.

#### SALVADOR.

##### **Suspected Yellow Fever—San Salvador and Vicinity.**

Under date of June 30, 1924, the United States minister at Guatemala City notified the State Department to the effect that the Republic of Guatemala had declared quarantine against Salvador on account of several cases suspicious of yellow fever.

On June 28 Surgeon Knight left for Salvador for a conference with the Salvadorean authorities regarding the disease.

On July 12 Surgeon Knight wired as follows: "Re Salvador. Two deaths June 10 and June 23 suspicious yellow fever. Five suspicious cases recovered. No cases since 23d. Mosquito control good. No quarantine at present indicated, but further study of possible focal infection by an expert advised."

On July 24 Surgeon Knight reported that information had been received to the effect that there had been three additional deaths in San Salvador having symptoms suspicious of yellow fever, and that

during the week preceding there had been reported a number of suspicious cases in San Salvador and the adjoining suburbs.

Quarantine officers at all United States quarantine stations are being kept fully advised of these developments.<sup>1</sup>

### UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA.

#### Plague.

During the week ended June 14, 1924, a case of plague occurring in a native was reported in the Orange Free State. The case occurred on a farm in the Hoopstad district.

#### Smallpox—Typhus Fever—Month of May, 1924.

During the month of May, 1924, smallpox and typhus fever were reported in the Union of South Africa as follows:

*Smallpox*.—Native, 43 cases and 1 death; European population, 10 cases; total, 53 cases with 1 death.

*Typhus fever*.—Native, 85 cases with 9 deaths; white population, 2 cases; total, 87 cases with 9 deaths. For distribution of typhus fever occurrence according to States, see p. 2127.
