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
RUBELLA (GERMAN MEASLES) IN 1964

During 1964, major epidemics of rubella were recorded throughout 8 states in the East, South and Midwest (see figure below). Based on reports available from 23 states, the epidemic appears to have been the largest since 1935. Occurring first in New England in mid-winter, the epidemic spread to the West and South. The Pacific Coast and Rocky Mountain states were only minimally involved in the epidemic.


Rubella, as a clinical illness, is of relatively little concern, systemic symptoms being mild and the course of the disease being only 3 to 5 days. However, infections

in women in the first trimester of pregnancy can result in serious congenital malformations as well as a frequently fatal purpura in children born of these infected mothers. A substantial number of newborns were afflicted during the 1964 epidemic.

Because of the national importance of this disease, the Biennial Conference of State and Territorial Epidemiologists has recommended that rubella be placed on the list of nationally reportable diseases, effective January 1, 1966.

SOURCES OF DATA

This Supplement carries final figures on the reported incidence of notifiable diseases in 1964 based on summaries submitted by the individual States and Territories through the National Morbidity Reporting System except for the data on incidence of tuberculosis, collected by the Tuberculosis Branch, venereal diseases collected by the Venereal Disease Branch, and encephalitis gathered by the Encephalitis Surveillance Unit, of the Communicable Disease Center.

Data obtained by the Tuberculosis and Venereal Disease Branches have been published in the Supplement in prior years. The data for encephalitis in the current issue have been derived from special summary reports devoted exclusively to encephalitis and its various manifestations. Because 1964 was the first year for which

encephalitis cases were reportable in two categories, primary including cases of unknown etiology, and post-infectious, the assignment of cases into these two groups was centralized in the Encephalitis Surveillance Unit to assure uniformity in categorizing such cases.

The illustrative materials depicting disease trends are presented for the first time in a Supplement and are for the most part based on charts and graphs carried in the 1964 issues of the Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report. The data are from the National Morbidity Reporting System, National Surveillance Programs, and the National Vital Statistics Division. The population estimates used in computation of rates are from the Bureau of the Census, Current Population Reports, Series P-25.


DIPHTHERIA

 and Case-Fatality Ratio, United States, 1920-1964







ENCEPHALITIS

and Month of Onset, 1964





POSTINFECTIOUS ENCEPHALITIS

By Month of Onset, 1964




ARTHROPOD-BORNE ENCEPHALITIS*

 (on overlapping Log Scale)




MEASLES (RUBEOLA)

 Percent Distribution by Age, 1959-1963






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











Deaths in the United States, 1947-1963




PNEUMONIA AND INFLUENZA



Paralytic Cases by Date of Onset, 1961-1964




PARALYTIC POLIOMYELITIS




Five-Year Age Groups, United States, 1964




Reported Cases in the United States, 1935-1964




ROCKY MOUNTAIN SPOTTED FEVER
Counties With 1 or More Reported Cases, United States, 1963





Human Isolations Per 100,000 Population, 1964





Seasonal Distribution of Isolations from 17 States





Cases and Deaths, United States, 1955-1964



Percent Distribution of Total by Age*







Reported Cases by Year, United States, 1948-1964




TULAREMIA
Seasonal Distribution, Percent of Cases by Month, United States, 1959-1963






TYPHUS FEVER, FLEA-BORNE (ENDEMIC, MURINE)
Reported Cases, United States, 1949-1964





MURINE TYPHUS
