ALABAMA—*Mobile*.—Month of March, 1895. Population, 31,076. Total deaths, 73, including 14 from phthisis pulmonalis.

Month of April, 1895. Total deaths, 61, including phthisis pulmonalis, 12; and measles, 1.

CALIFORNIA—*Los Angeles*.—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, 75,000. Total deaths, 119, including phthisis pulmonalis, 19; enteric fever, 6; and diphtheria, 1.

FLORIDA.—Month of March, 1895. Reports to the State board of health from 45 counties, including the cities of Jacksonville and Pensacola, having an aggregate population of 391,422, show a total of 310 deaths, including phthisis pulmonalis, 42; enteric fever, 5; diphtheria, 10; croup, 3; and measles, 5.

MAINE—*Portland*.—Four weeks ended May 18, 1895. Estimated population, 40,000. Total deaths, 49, including phthisis pulmonalis, 6; and enteric fever, 1.

MASSACHUSETTS—*Fitchburg*.—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, 29,383. Total deaths, 30, including 3 from phthisis pulmonalis.

MICHIGAN.—Week ended May 18, 1895. Reports to the State board of health from 54 observers indicate that inflammation of kidney and consumption increased, and that erysipelas, remittent fever, influenza, and pneumonia decreased in area of prevalence. Phthisis pulmonalis was reported present during the week at 154 places, scarlet fever at 37, measles at 20, diphtheria at 13, enteric fever at 12, and smallpox at 3 places.

MINNESOTA—*St. Paul*.—Estimated population, 20,300. Total deaths, 112, including phthisis pulmonalis, 20; enteric fever, 1; and diphtheria, 1.

NEW JERSEY—*Newark*.—Month of November, 1894. Estimated population, 181,830. Total deaths, 301, including phthisis pulmonalis 35; enteric fever, 2; smallpox, 1; scarlet fever, 5; diphtheria, 12; and whooping cough, 3.

Month of December, 1894. Total deaths, 308, including phthisis pulmonalis, 38; enteric fever, 6; scarlet fever, 3; diphtheria, 19; smallpox, 1; and whooping cough, 2.

NEW YORK—*Batavia*.—Month of February, 1895. Estimated population, 7,500. Total deaths, 7, including scarlet fever, 3; diphtheria, 1; and measles, 1.

Month of March, 1895. Total deaths not reported. No deaths from contagious diseases.

Month of April, 1895. Total deaths not reported. Two deaths from diphtheria.

*Hornellsville*.—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, 12,000. Total deaths, 16. No deaths from contagious diseases.

TENNESSEE—*Chattanooga*.—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, white, 27,000; colored, 13,000; total, 40,000. Deaths, white, 13;

colored, 23; total, 36, including phthisis pulmonalis, 4; enteric fever, 1; and scarlet fever, 2.

*Clarksville.*—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, white, 6,000; colored, 4,000; total, 10,000. Deaths, white, 2; colored, 3; total, 5. No deaths from contagious diseases.

*Columbia.*—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, white, 3,009; colored, 2,320; total, 5,329. Deaths, white, 2; colored, 4; total, 6; including 1 from whooping cough.

*Cholera.*

[Translated in this Bureau from the "Veröffentlichungen des Kaiserlichen Gesundheitsamtes," Berlin, May 8, 1895.]

RUSSIA.—The following additional cases were reported to the medical department up to April 20: In the government of Volhynia, from March 17 to April 6, 112 cases, 36 deaths; in Podolia, from March 24 to April 13, 22 cases, 13 deaths.

ARABIA.—The first cholera cases at Mecca occurred April 21, in the persons of a woman arrived from the Cape of Good Hope, a native of Morocco, a Soudanese, and 6 soldiers. On April 22, 10 deaths were reported.

At Camaran, from March 23 to April 9, 29 cases and 25 deaths occurred among arrivals by the steamer *Muhammedié*. Among the arrivals by the steamer *Zobeida*, from March 30 to April 21, 56 cases and 147 deaths were reported.

Besides these, 1 of the sanitary guard and 3 soldiers of the camp watch died of cholera. During the voyage from Bombay 1 death and several cases of sickness, from other causes than cholera, occurred on the *Muhammedié*. During the week before the vessel sailed only 1 death from cholera was reported at Bombay. No case of sickness of any kind occurred on board the *Zobeida* during her voyage.

At Djeddah 28 deaths were reported May 1.

ARGENTINA.—During the month of March cholera continued to decline. Isolated cases were still reported in the city and province of Buenos Ayres.

EAST INDIES—*Calcutta*.—During the week from March 24 to 30 there were 133 choleraic deaths.

## CHINA.

*Plague in China—Smallpox at Whampoa and Canton.*

Under date of April 29, 1895, the United States consul at Canton writes as follows:

Smallpox is prevalent at Whampoa, 12 miles east of Canton, and some cases of smallpox have occurred in and about Canton during the past week and during the month of April.

The bubonic plague has appeared at Pakhoi, at the island of Hai-man, and at Swatow, and at several places in the interior of this province of Kwangtung, but as yet no plague has this year occurred at Canton.

## MEXICO.

*Denial of reported Yellow Fever at Mazatlan.*

NOGALES, ARIZ., May 20, 1895.

SIR: I have the honor to inform you that I have just received a telegram from Dr. P. Figueroa, of Guaymas, denying the published report of yellow fever in Mazatlan. Dr. Figueroa is vice-governor of Sonora and a member of the national board of health of the Republic of Mexico, and informs me that he is in telegraphic communication with Mazatlan.

## STATISTICAL REPORTS.

AUSTRALIA—*Brisbane.*—Month of February, 1895. Estimated population, 93,657. Total deaths, 58, including enteric fever, 5; diphtheria, 2; and measles, 1.

*New South Wales—New Castle.*—Month of March, 1895. Estimated population, 15,329. Total deaths, 26, including enteric fever, 1, and diphtheria, 2.

CUBA—*Havana.*—Under date of May 25, 1895, the United States sanitary inspector reports as follows:

There were 131 deaths in this city during the week ending May 23, 1895. Three of those deaths were caused by yellow fever, with 8 new cases approximately, 10 were caused by enteric fever, 3 by so-called pernicious fever, 10 by enteritis, 1 by dysentery, 10 by smallpox, and 4 by pneumonia.

FRANCE—*Roubaix.*—Month of April, 1895. Estimated population, 120,000. Total deaths, 217, including cholera, 3; enteric fever, 2; diphtheria, 1; measles, 1; and whooping cough, 4.

GREAT BRITAIN—*England and Wales.*—The deaths registered in 33 great towns of England and Wales during the week ended May 11 corresponded to an annual rate of 17.7 a thousand of the aggregate population, which is estimated at 10,591,530. The lowest rate was recorded in Swansea, viz, 12.9, and the highest in Plymouth, viz, 25.8 a thousand.

*London.*—One thousand three hundred and ninety-eight deaths were registered during the week, including measles, 34; scarlet fever, 11; diphtheria, 38; whooping cough, 35; enteric fever, 8; and diarrhea and dysentery, 19. The deaths from all causes corresponded to an annual rate of 16.6 a thousand. In greater London, 1,795 deaths were registered, corresponding to an annual rate of 15.5 a thousand of the population. In the "outer ring" the deaths included 18 from measles, and 18 from diphtheria.

*Ireland.*—The average annual death rate represented by the deaths registered during the week ended May 11, in the 16 principal town districts of Ireland was 25.2 a thousand of the population. The lowest rate was recorded in Galway, viz, 3.8, and the highest in Armagh, viz,
