Established in 1998, NCCCP provides the funding, guidance, and technical assistance that 66 current programs use to design and implement impactful, strategic, and sustainable plans to prevent and control cancer.

2017 - CDC supports 66 programs with its fourth nationwide CCC funding opportunity



2005 - All 50 states funded for CCC activities



2005 - National Cancer Survivorship Resource Center created



2008 - NCCCP 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary highlighted in Preventing Chronic Disease



2010 – 13 programs received additional funds to demonstrate policy, systems, and environmental changes
