## 2019 provisional data for the United States

- Chikungunya virus disease became a nationally notifiable condition in 2015. Cases are reported to CDC by state and local health departments using standard case definitions.
- As of September 5, 2019, a total of 57 chikungunya virus disease cases with illness onset in 2019 have been reported to ArboNET from 21 U.S. states (Table & Map). All reported cases occurred in travelers returning from affected areas. No locallytransmitted cases have been reported from U.S. states.
- A total of two chikungunya virus disease cases with illness onset in 2019 have been reported to ArboNET from U.S. territories (Table). To date, two locally acquired cases have been reported from Puerto Rico.

States reporting chikungunya virus disease cases – United States, 2019 (as of September 5, 2019)


