

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Updated March 23, 2020

This page will be updated regularly at noon Mondays through Fridays. Numbers close out at 4 p.m. the observe reporting.

CDC is responding to an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus. The outbreak first started Wuhan, China, but cases have been identified in a growing number of other locations internationally, including the U States. In addition to CDC, many public health laboratories are now testing for the virus that causes COVID-19.

- Total cases: 33,404
- Total deaths: 400
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 54 (50 states, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and US Virgin Islands)





COVID-19 cases in the United States by date of illness onset, Januar 12, 2020, to March 22, 2020, at 4pm ET (n=4,038)**




