



Cumulative total number of COVID-19 cases in the United States by report date, January 12, 2020 to April 12, 2020, at 4pm ET (n=554,849)*†




COVID-19 cases in the United States by date of illness onset, January 12, 2020, to April 12, 2020, at 4pm ET (n=284,429)*
