

Cases and deaths are reported by state Department of Corrections and the Federal Bureau of Prisons at the facility-level unless indicated by *, which designates cumulative state-wide totals (county-wide for DC) from one or more facilities, not named, in addition to cases and deaths reported from any named facilities. Data contain cumulative confirmed COVID-19 counts in U.S. correctional and detention facilities, separately for staff and residents, starting from March 31, 2020. Data collected from the Department of Corrections websites are principally represented by prisons, with exception of a few states that include jails.
